BE IT EVER SO HUMBLE

-there's never been **anyplace** like the Pumphouse Theatre! And for better or for worse it has been home to Kentwood Players for the past two years of production, and for well over a year prior to that while it was being converted into a theatre.

When the Players held their first meeting in the pumphouse, (for it was not a theatre then), they brought candles in saucers for light, and a few folding chairs and crates for seats.

But high spirits, if not better sense, prevailed, and "Fifth Season" was cast, rehearsals started, and work on the building began. The first show was to open in a matter of months. But the City of Los Angeles, along with the dwindling bank balance kept pushing the opening date further and further away.

Well, "Fifth Season" did open, but after more than a year and with a different cast but the same old enthusiasm. Drama, comedy, mystery, farce, all came in due course with "Sleeping Prince", "Mousetrap", and "Streetcar Named Desire", which won the Players Annual Masque Award for Best Production. "Janus", "Middle of the Night", and "Light up the Sky" followed. The lease, expiring January 1960, could not be renewed. A campaign to save the Pumphouse for those two or three years ensued. But then realizing it would be money down the drain to refurbish the building for only a few years, the Players abandoned their campaign and instead looked for another home in the community.

Soon the witches and spirits took over the Pumphouse with presentation of "Dark of the Moon", then "Bus Stop", "Big Knife", and lastly, "Blithe Spirit".

Kentwood Players are, of course, more than a little unhappy about losing the Pumphouse. But the memories, the friendships, the short tempers, the successes, the work and the fun are not lost. The Players have the right idea. Ask any of them how they feel about losing the theatre, they'll shrug and say, "Well, that's show biz".
