EDYTHE SILLS (Dr. Barrow) has been very active in KP since moving here from New York less than two years ago. Edythe has done radio and TV work in the east and just completed a TV pilot project here.

BILL BUHLER (Dr. Schlesinger) has not appeared on the Kentwood stage since "Detective Story," given at the Continental Theatre. For his portrayal of Stanley Kowalski in "Streetcar Named Desire," Bill received Best Actor award. He has been vice-president of KP and served on the executive committee for many years.

JOHN SILLS (Don Gregory) is also appearing for the first time on any stage, but should feel quite at home in Westchester Playhouse. His mother is Edythe. And father, Gil, is in the light booth.
