
KENTWOOD PLAYERS PRESENT AGATHA CHRISTIE'S

JOSEPH G. PACELLI, JR. received his B.A. in directing and post graduate study in scenic design at the University of Connecticut. Since his arrival on the west coast in 1956, Mr. Pacelli has directed and/or designed for Beverly Hills Playhouse, Circle Theatre, and Morgan Theatre, to list only a few. Among his film credits as a motion picture set designer are "Advise and Consent" and "Gypsy;" with television credits including "The Donna Reed Show," and "Sea Hunt," again to list only a few. As a dramaturgist, Mr. Pacelli worked on the short film, "When We Sleep," an International Film Festival bronze medal-winning production, which premiered at Coronet Theatre. ABOUT THE CAST . . .

JIM PINFOLD (Rogers) is a newcomer to Kentwood Players. His previous acting experience was with the Belfrey Little Theatre in Lake Geneva, Wisconsin ten years ago.

BETTY D. ORTEGA (Mrs. Rogers) was last seen on the Kentwood Player stage in "Detective Story" at the Continental Theatre. She has also appeared in "Tunnel of Love" and "Picnic," locally. Currently she is working in a movie. Betty has been a high fashion model and also a jazz singer.

BILL FREELAND (Fred Narracott) is a subscription member who has decided to see how it feels to be on the other side of the footlights. Welcome to the ranks of active members, Bill.

BARBARA SPRINGER (Vera Claythorne) has had six years of experience in musical shows, choral concerts and operettas. Among her list of credits are leads in "Oklahoma," "The Lowland Sea," "Of Thee I Sing" and "Finian's Rainbow." She has also been a soloist for the Occidental Glee Clubs and is a church soloist.

JOHN MARSTON (Philip Lombard) is another newcomer to Kentwood Players and is experiencing his first venture in community theatre.

DAVID MARSHALL (Anthony Marston) became a Kentwood Player member in "Taming of the Shrew" in the role of Lucentio. Dave is a graduate of Santa Monica high school.

MYRON COLE (William Blore), another newcomer to Kentwood Players, has been appearing with the North American Players for the past two and one-half years. He has been in "Christmas Carol," "Dirty Work at the Crossroads," "See How They Run," and "The Curtain Rises."

JACK WATTS (General MacKenzie) runs to military roles. For KP he has been in "See How They Run," as Sergeant Towers and in "Make a Million," as the General. His previous theatrical experience was during his years at UCLA.

ALICE CLARK (Emily Brent) has appeared with Morgan Theatre in their production of "The Big Knife," and in The Pasadena Playhouse production of "Slaughter of the Innocent."

GEORGE ANDRE (Sir Lawrence Wargrave) became interested in dramatics at the age of 15 at the Chicago Boys' Club. His theatrical career, as Mr. Andre, was interrupted by military service in Europe. His many and varied radio appearances include, to list only a few, "Woman in White," "The Joe E. Brown Story" and assignments with such personalities as Imogene Coca, Burgess Meredith and Richard Carlson. Locally he has appeared in the Morgan Theatre production of "The Big Knife" for which he received their best character actor award.

MARK DENNIS (Dr. Armstrong) just recently completed a role in Hampton Players' production of "Look Homeward Angel." His previous appearance with Kentwood Players was in "See How They Run." Mark is an assistant film editor at ABC and has had small roles in movies at Columbia.
