
COMING ATTRACTIONS . . .

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR . . .

With this production MARK DENNIS returns for his third directorial stint with Kentwood. Other plays he has directed are MARY, MARY and TENDER TRAP. Mark has a wide and varied background of show business and theatre experience. On stage we've seen him in THE HAPPY TIME, SUMMER AND SMOKE and TEN LITTLE INDIANS. Mark has been a very active member on stage and behind the scenes for some ten years at Kentwood.

ABOUT THE PRODUCER . . .

Behind this production is a man of many talents. CHARLES REYNOLDS won the Best Actor Award for WHO'S AFRAID OF VIRGINIA WOOLF and he recevied the Masque Award as Best Actor for his work in ALL THE KING'S MEN and THE TENDER TRAP. Chuck directed the HAPPY TIME and has been seen on stage in such plays as TENDER TRAP, RAINMAKER, GLASS MENAGERIE, SHOT IN THE DARK and SEE HOW THEY RUN. Chuck has also served several terms on the board of directors as well as having been responsible for the sets on many productions.

ABOUT THE CAST . . .

RICHARD HOLMES (Walter Owen) was active with little theatre in Denver, appearing in BELL, BOOK AND CANDLE, DUMBELL PEOPLE IN A BARBELL WORLD and MOON OF THE MISBEGOTTEN. Rich has been a member of Kentwood for the past year and a half. Since then we have seen him on stage in such plays as THE NIGHT OF THE IGUANA and BAREFOOT IN THE PARK. He also has been very active in Kentwood workshop productions and did lighting for ROSE TATTOO. He acted as producer for THE NIGHT OF THE IGUANA.

JERRY SILVERS (Jim Bolton) is a three-time winner of the Masque Award for Best Director for his production of STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE, RAINMAKER and DARK AT THE TOP OF THE STAIRS. Other directing credits are THE NIGHT OF THE IGUANA, A MAJORITY OF ONE, THE GREAT SEBASTIANS and ANNE OF A THOUSAND DAYS. In 1967 Jerry directed an innovation for Kentwood Players, a concert reading of DON JUAN IN HELL. This is Jerry's first time back on the board after an eight-year absence.

ELLEN LEDDY ARNOLD (Doris Owen) has appeared on stage in A SHOT IN THE DARK, SUNDAY IN NEW YORK and RED SHOES. Ellen has had an active ten years in movies, TV and TV commercials. She is the wife of Gary Arnold, candidate for state senate and assembly. She combines community activities with politics and the theatre for a creative life.

MURRAY WEISSFELD'S (Stan Herman) sure comedy touch has won him many awards. He won Best Supporting Actor in the L.A. Drama Festival, Masque Awards for Best Supporting Actor in A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM, AUNTIE MAME and HAPPY TIME. He was also seen in THE GREAT SEBASTIANS.

LARRY VERDUGO (Winston Garand) was just seen in our last production on Kentwood's stage in WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION. Larry's list of credits include HAMLET, ANDOCLES AND THE LION, KING ARTHUR, SUDDENLY LAST SUMMER and THE ENCHANTED. In addition Larry created the role of Father Leary in Ray Bradbury's CLEAR VIEW OF AN IRISH MIST.

RAYMOND KARK (Ken Powell), a man of numerous talents, was last seen on the Kentwood stage in A MAN FOR ALL SEASONS. A speech and drama graduate of the University of Minnesota in Duluth, Ray was seen on stage in St. Joan and worked with the Duluth newspapers as a sports cartoonist. Since coming to L.A. he has been seen in such plays as THE VISIT, HATFUL OF RAIN, CARL SANDBURG, YES and MARK OF A LARGE LEAD PENCIL.
