ABOUT THE CAST . . .

SUSAN MICHAEL (Annie) is new to Kentwood, and just newly back in her native L.A. area. Susan attended both El Camino State College and San Fernando Valley State College, where she appeared in such plays as THE MADWOMAN OF CHAILLOT, DIARY OF ANN FRANK, CINDERELLA, and ARMS AND THE MAN. Most recently Susan taught speech and drama at Santa Paula High School and directed BLYTHE SPIRIT and a musical version of THE WIZARD OF OZ. We welcome her to Kentwood.

DEE TURQUAND (Fran) first appeared at Kentwood as an Okinawan in TEAHOUSE OF THE AUGUST MOON. She was Japanese in A MAJORITY OF ONE, and most recently one of the English sisters in THE ODD COUPLE.
