

#### ABOUT THE DIRECTOR . . .

MONTY ASH. Our most distinguished actor/director. He brings a lifetime of theatrical know-how to our stage. He began his career as a child actor in English pantomimes, attended the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts and has been active in every phase of the theatre in England and both costs of the United States. His favorite role was Art Hockstader in THE BEST MAN. He directed A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE which won the Los Angeles County Adult Drama Award in 1967. He is also very active in the business affairs of Kentwood, being on the Board of Directors, and Publicity and Public Relations Chairman.

#### ABOUT THE PRODUCER . . .

CATHY JONES. The co-producer of NOBODY LOVES AN ALBATROSS. This is her first solo production task, which she accepted due to the sudden illness of the original producer. Without many previous credits she nevertheless indicates that she will be one of our best producers, by virtue of continuous work, at all hours, and the happy facility of getting others to pitch in and help. She feels she is fortunate in being able to work with such an illustrious director.

#### ABOUT THE CAST . . .

KARL THOMAS (Mr. Frederick Ritter) Majored in Drama and Art. His first professional appearance (THE DRUNKARD) lasted 18 years. A past Kentwood prexy, he is also a director, set designer. He directed Kentwood's A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM and won a best minor award for his role in THE TENTH MAN.

FRED BAUM (Mr. Huxley Hossefrosse) Well known on the European stages as a stand-up comedian, he was forced to flee Austria when Hitler took over. He has appeared on TV frequently. On the Kentwood stage, his favorite holes have been in THE TENTH MAN and THE GREAT SEBASTIANS. He is the musical comedy director for Venice High School.

MAX HELDRING STORMES (Mr. Spindler) Born in Tsingtao, China of Navy parents, he has appeared on stages throughout the world, including the Pasadena Playhouse, and in Old Globe Theatre Shake-spearean festivals. He is also an artist and set designer. His most recent role was as Jose, the muleteer, in Kentwood's MAN OF LA MANCHA.

PERRY PAGE (Mr. Ralph Twiller) born in Norwalk, Conn. His time is equally divided between TV appearances and the Kentwood stage, where he appeared in GUYS AND DOLLS, and more recently in NOBODY LOVES AN ALBATROSS.

JERRE PAINE (Teddy Spearing) Born in Toulon, France, has appeared on French, Japanese and U.S. stages since the age of 10. He is a professional dress designer and display artist, and did the costumes for this production. (See sketches in the foyer). His acting credits include TAMING OF THE SHREW and BELL, BOOK AND CANDLE.

IRVING NORD (Mr. Stage Manager) Born in Brooklyn, served his stage apprenticeship on the "Borscht Circuit," where he excelled as a stand-up and fall-down comedian. He appears in many of the local Temple shows, and was recently seen on our stage in CASE OF LIBEL.

JAN MARCOM (Mrs. Paula Ritter) Her first appearance on any stage, was in a twin sister, song and dance act at the age of four . . . and she hasn't been off-stage since. A founding member of Kentwood Players, she has served in many capacities, in addition to acting. A former Kentwood prexy, she also won the Danny Thomas Award for Best Comedy Performance, her role in BLITHE SPIRIT. She has appeared in 28 Kentwood productions and two Masque Awards, for Madame Arcati in BLITHE SPIRIT and as Mrs. Durant in CACTUS FLOWER.

DIA KAY (Mrs. J. Duro Pampinelli) Also one of the first year members, was born in a stage trunk. On-stage since the age of five, she has appeared in light opera, and owned and operated her own theatre (Playhouse 26). She received the Los Angeles County Adult Drama Award as Outstanding Actress for her role in VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE and a Masque Award for her role in MAN OF ALL SEASONS. She is married to a doctor and they have four children . . . hence is writing a play about her family life.

ADA LILLY (Mrs. Nelly Fell) From an old carnival family, was doing the hoochy koochy dance on the Midways at the age of eight. Her professional credits include an eight-year run in THE DRUNKARD where she met and married KARL THOMAS. She majored in Speech and Drama at UCLA, and recently won a Masque Award for Best Supporting Actress in ABSENCE OF A CELLO.

LEE KESSLER (Miss Florence McCrickett) holds a Master's Degree in Drama. Was a college drama teacher, and director of university productions (Univ. of Wisconsin) for many years, which included a DOLL'S HOUSE and THE FANTASTIKS. This is her first role with Kentwood Players.

SUSAN SHARP (Mrs. Clara Sheppard) Previous stage appearances in schol plays and summer stock. This is her first appearance on the Kentwood stage. Off-stage she operates as a free-lance writer and advertising copy writer. Her most recent role was as Mrs. Warriner in DESK SET with the Facets Players.

LINDA KITCH (Jenny) Majored in Drama and Speech at Univ. of Calif. Her first theatrical experience has been at the Westchester Playhouse, which has included most of the unsung tasks behind the scenes, including operating lights and sound, props, clean-up, etc. She has appeared on stage in several KP workshops. (LAST OF RED HOT LOVERS, etc.)

JOHN K. HERSHEY (Male Understudy) Born in Chicago. Studied Drama at Univ. of Illinois. Has appeared on TV and in summer stock in the Midwest. He recently appeared in THE BEST MAN.
