

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR . . .

C. CLARKE BELL, a ten-year member of K.P. served as President and is currently on the Board of Directors. Clarke has worked in practically every phase of the theatre. Can be called upon on a moment's notice and will help out in any emergency. This year he directed the award-winning play at the A.D.A. Festival, REST IN PEACE, and received the Best Director Award for 1973. Other credits are WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION, WAIT UNTIL DARK, FOUR POSTER, etc. He recently directed STOP THE WORLD I WANT TO GET OFF at Community Theatre with great success.

ABOUT THE PRODUCER . . .

JACK WEINTRAUB takes his first mad fling at producing with this show! However, in two short years he has participated in all phases of production on numerous plays at Kentwood. Audiences here will remember his onstage work in THE DEVIL'S ADVOCATE, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF, OUR TOWN, CAMELOT, etc.

ABOUT THE CAST . . .

JEANNETTE LYONS (Katherine). In the seven years that she has been a member of K.P., she is one of the "old regulars." Was last seen as Eliza in LOOK HOMEWARD ANGEL. This year she won the Best Actress Award in the A.D.A. Festival for her work in REST IN PEACE. Other credits with K.P. are CACTUS FLOWER, MAJORITY OF ONE, I CAN'T HEAR YOU WHEN THE WATER'S RUNNING, OUR TOWN, etc. Jeannette has been drama teacher at Webster College and Producer/Director of Educational TV series for the University of South Carolina. For over 20 years (a former child actress) she has spent on stage in everything from Shakespeare to musical comedy. She holds an M.F.A. in Drama from Catholic University.

SHERIDAN COLE (Mae). A K.P. member for over three years. Is a graduate in Speech and Drama from the State University of Iowa. Was first seen on our stage in 1971 in BEST MAN, which was her first venture since teaching English and Drama in the L.A. City Schools a few years ago. Another K.P. credit was in PLAZA SUITE last year. Other credits are THE FRONT PAGE, TIGER AT THE GATES, THE LOWER DEPTHS, etc. BOB GASTALDO (John). Was last seen on K.P. stage as Papa in THE HAPPY TIME, and before that in MARY, MARY. Before he came to California he was active in Little Theatre at the University of New Mexico, the Albuquerque Little Theatre and Old Town Players where he appeared as Abe Lincoln in ABE LINCOLN IN ILLINOIS. Other credits are CAIN MUTINY, LADY'S NOT FOR BURNING, DEVIL'S DISCIPLE, etc.

ANITA McCULLOM (Janet). A newcomer to K.P. We welcome this wholesome young lady. She started her acting career during her teens in high school in LOVE RIDES THE RAILS, OH DAD POOR DAD, THE CRUCIBLE. Is Attending Cal State College studying English and Drama. An excellent pianist, she was Musical Director of STOP THE WORLD, I WANT TO GET OFF and was seen in PLAY IT AGAIN SAM in Community Theatre. Worked in DEVIL'S ADVO-CATE behind the scenes.

KERRY MAHAN (Philip). This young man is a newcomer to Kentwood, but far from being a newcomer to theatre, as one of his first ventures was at the age of 14 at Orville Wright Jr. High School in the role of Ebenezer Scrooge in A CHRISTMAS CAROL. He went on to win the Macy Award for Best Actor from the City of L.A. in BAREFOOT IN THE PARK. Other credits are THE BOYFRIEND, A THOUSAND CLOWNS, SPOON RIVER ANTHOLOGY, etc. We welcome you aboard.

JAMES SCHNAUSS (Jerry). This youngster is only 11 years old and this is his second play. The K.P. production of INHERIT THE WIND as Howard Blair was his first. He has worked backstage in numerous other K.P. productions and helped all day on Work Sundays.
