ABOUT THE DIRECTOR . . .

C. CLARKE BELL won the A.D.A. Festival Award in 1973 for directing "REST IN PEACE." He also directed it for Kentwood as our "Special." Other directorial credits are WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION, WAIT UNTIL DARK, FOUR POSTER and SILENT NIGHT, LONELY NIGHT. A 15 year member of K.P., having served on the Board of Directors several seasons, wearing different hats, such as House Manager, Production Manager, Publicity Chairman, Vice-President, Treasurer and President. He is currently serving as our Production Manager. He has worked extensively backstage, lights and sound, set designer, and has also won awards for his performances in CABARET and ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST.

ABOUT THE PRODUCER . . .

MONTY ASH, a member of the Board of Directors, is currently Publicity Chairman. He joined K.P. eleven years ago. A native of England, he brings a lifetime of theatrical experience to our stage. Directed last year's production of ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST. Produced the musical CAMELOT at K.P. Appeared in several productions at K.P., some of which are THE BEST MAN, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF and, most recently, SUNSHINE BOYS.

ABOUT THE CAST

JONAS AGEE (Don Baker) made his first appearance on our stage in THE SUBJECT WAS ROSES. He studied at the High School for the Performing Arts in N.Y. and The Circle in the Square. He was seen off-Broadway in the Grammy-nominated musical TOUCH and has appeared in DEATH OF A SALESMAN and PING PONG.

JAYNE SHAW (Jill Tanner) received her training in New York at the High School for the Performing Arts and Circle in the Square. This is her first appearance on the Kentwood stage. Some of her acting credits are BLITHE SPIRIT, LOVERS and THE BALCONY.

DODI MAZEROV (Mrs. Baker) is a familiar face at Kentwood, having joined in 1954. Her most recent accomplishment was Musical Director for "Oklahoma." She is the recipient of nine of the highly coveted Masque Awards, her most recent being Best Director for CAT ON A HOT TIN ROOF. She has received Best Actress Award for her performances in STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE, SUMMER AND SMOKE, ALL THE KING'S MEN, and her most dramatic role in WHO'S AFRAID OF VIRGINIA WOOLF? She is currently Vice-President of Kentwood Players.

MARIO MARIANA (Ralph Austin) is a graduate of the University of Washington in the Theatre Arts Program. He appeared at the Seattle Repertory Theatre in HAMLET and THREE MEN ON A HORSE. Other roles were in STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE and COUNT DRACULA. This is Mario's first appearance on the K.P. stage.
