ABOUT THE DIRECTOR . . .

MONTY ASH — A 12 year member of K.P. Director, Producer, Actor, Writer, Member of the Board of Directors. He first directed A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE in 1967, and in later years A CASE OF LIBEL, and THE PRICE, for all of which he received our annual Best Director Awards. Other K.P. productions he has directed are, INHERIT THE WIND, ALL MY SONS, MAN FOR ALL SEASONS, THE TORCHBEARERS, and recently ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST. As an actor he appeared in TWELVE ANGRY MEN, SUNSHINE BOYS, BEST MAN, MAN FOR ALL SEASONS, CAMELOT, ANDERSONVILLE TRIAL, and his unforgetable role of the Rabbi in FIDDLER ON THE ROOF.

ABOUT THE PRODUCER . . .

MELISSA HARRED — Although Melissa is only 19, she has been with Kentwood for 10 years. She appeared in our workshop of ALICE IN WONDERLAND. She made her debut as producer in our production of NORMAN IS THAT YOU? She has extensive experience backstage having stage managed ALL THE WAY HOME, SUBJECT WAS ROSES, and NORMAN IS THAT YOU? With Del Rey Players she stage managed A Little Night Music, and at Inglewood Playhouse The Innocents. She also appeared on stage in Miracle Worker and My Sister Eileen at West High School.

ABOUT THE SCENIC DESIGNER . . .

SUSAN WELLS — A graduate of Venice High School, is currently attending Santa Monica College, studying Fine Arts. This is her first experience in Set Designing. She has appeared on stage in Matchmaker, Henry V, Gypsy, Guys and Dolls and has won many awards and trophies for her acting in High School and in the 1977 Shakespeare Festival. Her goal is to become an actress, singer, and dancer.

ABOUT THE CAST . . .

SEAN O'HAGEN — (Young Man) To quote Sean, 'I chose to follow a career as an actor because it's the only career offering me the total security of being forever insecure'. He studied Drama at USC, and at Loft Studio. He has appeared in Under the Yum Yum Tree, Royal Hunt of the Sun, Thurber Carnival, Henry Sweet Henry, Ladies in Retirement, and Goodnight Mrs. Puffin. At the Glendale Theatre, he appeared in the role of Don Baker, in Butterflies are Free.

DAVID OSHINS — (Little Boy) David is only 9 years old and this is his first experience on any stage. He is very interested in theatre, and is looking forward to his next play. He used to play baseball but he thinks that theatre is more to his liking.

ADAM SADOWSKY — (Little Boy) This young man is only 8 years old and he will be alternating with David. He too is new on stage. When asked what kind of work he has done in the theatre, his reply was, "What kind of background can you have when you are only eight years old?"

SUE BEBER — (Mother) The first production that K.P. did at this theatre in 1961 was, MAYBE TUESDAY, and Sue, a newcomer, was given the lead role. This was more than 17 years ago. After that she was in TWO FOR THE SEESAW, THE TENTH MAN, PLAZA SUITE, MIGHTY MAN IS HE, and SHOT IN THE DARK. At the Westside Jewish Center she appeared in Dear Me, the Sky is Falling, Best Man and Tunnel of Love. Most recently she was seen in Forty Carats at Manhattan Beach Playhouse.

RON BRADFORD — (Father) In 1968 Ron was seen on our stage for the first time in an unforgettable portrayal of Sir Thomas More in A MAN FOR ALL SEASONS, and in 1970, Dennis Corcoran in A CASE OF LIBEL. He has been active in stage work for the past eight years and has performed in such productions as Mary, Mary, The Little Hut, A Thurber Carnival, and Night of January 16th.
