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About The Lighting Designer - Jeff Carr

He has won the Kentwood Lighting Design Award for his work on "Agnes of God", "Chicago" and "Dracula". He was technical director at the Inglewood Playhouse for five years for lights and sound. About The Cast (in alphabetical order)

Ron Anderson (Etienne, Policeman #2/Frog)

Originated from Rhode Island, where he received his B.A. degree in Elm Ed, and Theatre Arts from Salve Regina College. Favorite roles include - Marcellus in "The Music Man" and Seymour in "Little Shop of Horrors". He appeared at Kentwood last season in "Cabaret".

Margie Bates (Marie /Butterfly)

She became a Kentwood member, eight years ago as of September. She loves France and loves to dance. And now that she can, do the Can-Can. She kicks her legs high in the air, then turns and shows her derriere.

Steven Batesole (Boris)

A longtime participant in community theater. This is Steven's first show with Kentwood Players. In various theaters during the past fifteen years he has performed in numerous productions. This show makes his fourth, under the direction of Lewis Hauser. You'd think he would've learned his lesson by now.

Tim Boeck (Co-Producer/Hercule/Bailiff/Penguin)

This is his first shot at producing (co-producing) actually- (thankfully) it could not have been a better first time. It is also his first time on Kentwood's stage since "Anything Goes". He is truly becoming a Tim-of-all-trades and loves it.

Gabrielle de Cuir (La Mome Pistache)

She is a graduate for UCLA's Theater Department. She is glad to be back on the Kentwood stage where she has garnered awards for her performances in "Same Time Next Year" Agnes Of God" and The Miracle Worker". Her local theatrical credits include "The Man Who Came to Dinner" at GCT, "Situation Comedy" at Knightsbridge and "The Real Thing" at the Morgan Wixson. Her most recent filmwork is in "Misconception", an American Film Institute Project.*

Jaz Davidson (Mimi/Jailer/Second)

She is a sixteen year old student from Hamilton High School and has performed with the Westside Ballet Co., Dance Electric and "Grand Hotel" at Palisades High, and recently received the Rae McDonald Memorial award for talent.

Sean Hilferty (Theophile/Policeman #1/Tiger)

Sean has played in Productions ranging from Shakespeare to Woody Allen. Favorites include Baker in "Into The Woods", Emcee in "Cabaret", Audrey II Voice in "Little Shop of Horrors", Starbuck in "110 In the Shade" and Lucentio in "Taming of the Shrew". In real life he is a graphic designer/writer/editor for the American Youth Soccer Organization.

Mark Martsolf (Judge Aristide Forestiere)
