Monty Ash - Director

A "lifetime" member of Kentwood, Monty has done it all – as producer, director, lighting/set designer, actor, portrait photographer – you name it. At present he is Publicity Chairman on the the Board of Directors. His most recent directorial credits are Murder by the Book and Steel Magnolias.

Tim Boeck - Assistant Director/Set Design

Here he is again in his usual role as assistant director. Strange that he is involved in the direction of drama but has acted only in musicals. In his last show, Can-Can, he was co-producer, played an artist, and is best remembered as the Penguin. Next time he hopes to be remembered as standing on his feet instead of landing on his southerly region.

Jenny Ryan - Producer

A long time producer at Kentwood, this marks Jenny's third production with her father, Monty Ash, the director. Jenny has worked on stage and off at Kentwood and has been an "official" member for 15 years, though she's been active here for 22 years. Her first appearance on stage here was in Inherit **The Wind** in 1973.

About The Cast (in alphabetical order)

Barbara Boone (Baroness Livenbaum)

This is Barbara's third appearance with Kentwood Players, having been in **Cemetery Club** and **Cabaret**. She is delighted to be working with such a fine cast and dedicated staff.

Robert Cecchino (Prince Paul)

Robert is appearing for the first time with the Kentwood Players and is thoroughly enjoying the experience. He has recently graduated with a B.A. in theatre from California State University, Northridge. Last year he played the lead in **Prelude To A Kiss**. He hopes to continue working in the theatre and growing as an actor.

Michael Cohen (Chernov)

This is Michael's fourth Kentwood appearance, having been seen in, See How They Run, Pack Of Lies, and Once More With Feeling. Roles in various South Bay productions include Alfred Doolittle in My Fair Lady and Sir Anthony Absolute in The Rivals. Other credits include Bus Stop, Equus, and Mame.

James Manley Green (Petrovin)

James last appeared as Chuchie in the Eastern Boys/Ensemble Theater production of **A Hatful Of Rain**. A few of his other credits include **Glengary Glen Ross** as George Aaronow for Eastern Boys and **Mr. Roberts** as Dowdy for the Newport Theatre Arts Center. Jim was also the assistant director for **A Little Night Music** at Torrance's James Armstrong Theatre. His most memorable job to date, however, was wrestling Dyan Cannon to a bed in the film **The End of Innocence**. "Tough work" says Jim, "but somebody had to do it". **Anastasia** marks his Kentwood debut.

Kim Harper (Charwoman – Annouchka)

A "Lifetime" member of Kentwood, Kim was recently seen in the title role of **Driving Miss Daisy**. Previous shows include **Steel Magnolias**, **Equus**, and **How The Other Half Loves**.

Dassa Kalmanson (Dowager Empress)

Dassa has been a member of Kentwood for 35 years, is a past President, and has served on the Board of Directors in various positions, currently as Secretary. Her Marcom Masque award performances include View From The Bridge, A Man For All Seasons, Hot L Baltimore, The Runner Stumbles, Mornings At Seven, and Social Security. Active in many theatres across the Southland, her most prized award is from the Pasadena Playhouse for her performances in View From the Bridge. Some of her most recent Kentwood performances have been as Ouiser in Steel Magnolias, Leatrice in Legends, and Ada in The Cemetery Club.

Steve Keeley (Bounine)

During the day Steve can usually be found working for UCLA's Center For Performing Arts. He has appeared previously here at Kentwood in Wait Until Dark, Annie Get Your Gun, and Critic's Choice, as well as other area productions of Pajama Game, How The Other Half Loves, Murder in Green Meadows, and I Ought to Be In Pictures.

Palmer Scott (Dr Serensky)

Having lived in California for nine months, Palmer is very pleased that his fourth appearance is with the Kentwood Players. His favorite roles include Sir Toby Belch in Twelfth Night, Mitch in A Streetcar Named Desire, Emory in The Boys in the Band, and Phillip Blake in Go Back For Murder. Palmer's current ambition is to ingratiate himself with rich and powerful producers.

Lily Silver (Varya)

This evening's performance marks Lily's debut at Kentwood. Her work in the theatre has been diverse, ranging from improvisational comedy to Shakespeare to contemporary roles. She has acted in film and directed theatre, both of which she enjoys very much. "I am thrilled to be part of such a distinguished theatrical community."

Stefanie Singer (Anastasia)

Stefanie received her B.A. in Theatre at U.C. Berkeley and continued postgraduate training in London and at U.C. Irvine. Favorite roles include Lysistrata and Antigone. A first-timer with the Kentwood Players, Stefanie would like to dedicate her performance to her family, Phyllis G., and Wendy R.

Tim Truby (Drivinitz and Sleigh Driver)

This is Tim's first L.A. stage appearance – most of his acting work has been in Washington D.C. and the Midwest. He has done leading roles in The Foreigner, The Nerd, Greater Tuna, As you Like It, and The Merchant of Venice, and has been in his share of forgettable films. Tim has an MFA from Catholic University.
