Her Masque awards for performances include View From the Bridge, A Man For All Seasons, Hot L Baltimore, The Runner Stumbles, Morning's At Seven, Social Security and Postmortem. Her most prized award is from the Pasadena Playhouse for her performance in Kentwood's production of View From The Bridge. Active in many theaters across the Southland she has had major leads in Death Of A Salesman, A Delicate Balance, and Cat On a Hot Tin Roof, to name a few. Her most recent performance on our stage was as Lilly Warner in Postmortem.

SCOT RENFRO (Ludie Watts) - The Trip To Bountiful marks Scot's second Kentwood production as an actor. He has also been active as Producer and Set Decorator in recent productions. He says of his character, "Ludie Watts is a wonderfully complex man - a truly sweet and gentle soul who is, ultimately, heroic. Any actor should be thrilled at the opportunity to portray Ludie, I certainly am."
