



About the Director/Choreographer...

Jeff Wallach was released from his vows as Brother Futon Fouette. This occurred after the Bishop discovered that Brother Futon had used his habit as a parachute to jump from a jetliner onto a burning building, where he single-handedly saved 300 pounds of Colombian coffee beans from the flames, giving rise to his favorite expression: "Come fly with me!" Since then, Jeff began his relationship with Kentwood in 1985 with a production of Damn Yankees. Next came his Marcom Masque Award-winning performance in Cabaret. Following were his directorial successes with Guys and Dolls, Man of La Mancha (another Marcom Masque award winner), and last years A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum. Jeff also won a Marcom Masque award for his role in last years Sylvia. Outside of Kentwood, Jeff has been director and/or choreographer for such productions as The Merry Widow, Cabaret. Antony and Cleopatra, and Godspell, to name a few. As a member of Actor's Equity, Jeff's stage career spans 15 years and includes roles in almost everything from melodrama to Mozart, Shakespeare to Sondheim. Jeff would like to personally thank his dear friends Alison and Van. plus Bill, Sheldon, Daniel, Richard, Scot, Calia, Maria, Arlene, Barbara, Frank, all who helped with this production - of course his 5 leading ladies and Vicki...this one's for you, I hope I do ya proud!

About the Music Director...

Bill Wolfe is our convent musician. He was part of the original group who established the leper colony served by the Order. Brother Bill achieved much notoriety when he published his first music book, *Two Part Inventions for the Fingerless*, which he dedicated to the lepers. Bill is happy to be music directing here at KP. His one and only other experience here was in the orchestra for *Follies* over ten years ago. Bills passion is for the theater, having music directed over 100 shows in the last 25 years. Some of his favorites to play and direct have been *Godspell, Pippin, Man of La Mancha, The Most Happy Fella* and, yes, *Nunsense* four times before! The little sisters just won't leave him alone! Bill is a successful voice coach and piano teacher, music director at St. George's Episcopal Church in Hawthorne and with his sister Linda created the Lifesong Workshop that supports singing and self-esteem. Bill is so happy to be married to a talented vocalist, Diane, and they live by the beach in Huntington.

About the Producers...

Alison & Van Mattiza felt they had a moral obligation to produce this show for the sisters. They were caretakers on the leper colony the sisters gave so tirelessly to and when they heard about the sisters unfortunate culinary mishap, they rushed to their side. Alison & Van have always enjoyed the theatre and have been members of KP for several years now. The couple also produced Kentwood's *The Cover of Life*, which won the Marcom Masque award for best play last year. Alison has been doing theatre for about 10 years and loves being both onstage and behind the scenes. Alison & Van would like to thank Jeff for letting them be a part of this exciting experience and the cast for being so incredibly talented and wonderful. About the Production Stage Manager...

Frank Roys is the assistant pastor of Mt. Saint Helen's. He was originally a monk in the Cistercian Abbey of Our Lady of Dallas, but was asked to leave after shouting "Places, please!" during Grand Silence. Father Frank was given the job of supervising *Nunsense* as a penance for past sins committed as production stage manager of *The Heiress, The Cover of Life* and *Mousetrap* here at Kentwood. About the Cast...

Sister Mary Amnesia is a truly lost soul. She arrived at the convent in her habit without a clue as to her identity...recalling only that a crucifix fell on her head. It has been said that she resembles Elizabeth A. Bouton who learned ventriloquism when she became a Little Sister of Hoboken. Previously, Elizabeth appeared as Jo Sterling in the West Coast premiere of Swingtime Canteen at Orange Coast College. Past credits include Tzeitel in OCC's 50th anniversary production of Fiddler on the Roof, Storyteller in FCLO's production of Children of Eden, Sally Bowles in Star Dinner Theatre's production of Cabaret, Maud Dunlop in PCCLO's premiere season of The Music Man, and Gloria Thorpe in BCLO's production of Damn Yankees. Elizabeth would like to dedicate her performance to her family and friends for their continual support. PS -"This one's for you Mom!"

Sister Robert Anne once dropped out of Verna's Cashier School in

Brooklyn. Reverend Mother took pity on poor little Anna Kristin McKoun and accepted her into the Order, where she became Sister Robert Anne. Today she is one of the most popular sisters with the kids because she speaks their language. Reverend Mother regrets that most of this language is unprintable. Sister Robert Anne had a very busy career before entering the convent as Anna Kristin "Krissy" & hails from South Carolina where she graduated from the College of Charleston. Favorite regional credits include the title role in *Gypsy*, Lili in *Carnival*, Dorothy in *The Wizard of Oz*, Minnie Fay in *Hello Dolly*, & Hodel in *Fiddler on the Roof*. When not on stage, Krissy enjoys working in TV and film. Her most recent credit is *Wes Craven's Carnival of Souls* now at a video store near you! This is Krissy's KP debut, and she is very happy to be a part of this show!

Sister Mary Regina. the beloved Mother Superior of the Little Sisters of Hoboken, is originally from Kilquirky a small county in Ireland. She headed the pioneering group of religious who established the leper colony in the Mediterranean and later returned to Hoboken as General of the Order. After Nunsense, Mother Superior says she has no desire to continue in the theatre, but she would consider doing national a commercial or television series to raise money for the Order. Prior to taking her vows, Sister May Regina was Valerie Sullivan. Valerie recently appeared as Abby in Arsenic and Old Lace. Other favorites include Quilters, Mammy Yokum in Li'l Abner, Miss Hannigan in Annie and also starring in the long running revue Bottoms Up at the Gold River Resort. Thanks to her husband John for supporting her dream to 'turn up the spotlight! Sister Mary Hubert entered the Little Sisters of Hoboken upon graduation from Precious Blood Elementary School. Sister currently serves the Order as Mistress of Novices, training new recruits. Her position is not unlike a drill sergeant, however, she is the first to point out that her approach is more gentle-but firm. Sister is a little "off-the-wall" at times but this has been attributed to the fact that she was trampled by a camel that went beserk during the annual nativity pageant held in the leper colony (she was portraying one of the three wise men). Sister Mary Hubert is the former Pau 7abb. Miss Tabb, a native New Yorker, has only recently arrived in Los Angeles after appearing in Baltimore City's Arena Players' production of Nunsense (as Sister Mary Amnesia). Other credits include, 12 Angry Women, Ella's Place, Crack, Cream and Sunshine, A Theme for Linda, Romeo & Juliet, the television production, Killing Memories, as well as several video and industrial films.

Sister Mary Leo came to the Order from an Illinois farm. She entered the convent to dedicate her life to God through the dance. Many people think that she took her name from the famous "leotard," but that is not true. She is named after her Uncle Leo, a notorious Chicago gangster. Sister thought that by taking his name, the Lord would go easy on him. She is a novice and has much to learn. Before joining the Order, Sister was known as Kristin Towers. Kristin is delighted to be playing Sister May Leo again having played her in Nunsense II at the Candlelight Pavilion. Kristin just finished a run of Little Shop of Horrors as Audrey and The Little Mermaid as the title role for Kelrick Productions. Recent tour credits include Christine in Phantom of the Opera and Cosette in Les Miserables in Taiwan. U.S. national tours include Yum Yum in The Mikado, The Angel in The Christmas Box and Josephine in H.M.S. Pinafore. Kristin would like to thank her boyfriend, Kent (shh, don't tell Reverend Mother), for all of his support and love and to the very talented cast and production team, "you all rock!!!"
