

About the Directorial Staff

Ed Cotter (Director) – Ed has wanted to bring *Blood Brothers* to Kentwood Players since he and his wife, De, first saw it in London in the year 2000. He hopes that you will enjoy the same rich theatrical experience that he did. Without De this production would not have been possible.

David Parke (Assistant Director, Understudy) – David is a recent graduate of the Hollywood High Performing Arts Magnet and is now attending Cal State Northridge with a double major in Theatre and Film. A long time Kentwood Junior Member, he is thrilled to be working alongside Ed.

Dan Redfeld (Musical Director) – Dan Redfeld attended Boston's New England Conservatory before transferring to UCLA where he received a degree in composition/conducting. He is the composer of *Little Women* (with Elaine Stritch and Deborah Gibson), *Canterville* (with George Ball) and several film and concert works. He was also Musical Director of *Triumph of Love*, *A Chorus Line*, *The Secret Garden*, *Sweeney Todd*, etc.

Victoria Miller (Choreographer) – A 19 year member, Vicki has choreographed over 35 musicals at KP as well as Theatre Palisades, Knightsbridge, Tiffany and others. She directed *Some Enchanted Evening*, *The World Goes Round* and *Blame It on the Movies* for KP's Concert Series. Dance credits include: *Folies Bergere*, Disneyland, Hollywood Bowl with Debbie Reynolds and Gene Kelly and CLO of South Bay.

About the Producers

De Cotter – De is a 40-year member of Kentwood Players. She enjoys painting, producing and helping out wherever she can. Producing Blood Brothers is a special pleasure because it is one of her and her husband's favorite musicals, and because the staff, cast and crew are truly beautiful people.

About the Cast

Gabe Alec (Policeman #2, Ensemble) – Gabe is proud to have represented the USA as a soloist at the 1992 World Expo in Seville, Spain. Theater credits include *Evita*, *The Secret Garden*, *West Side Story*, *Andrew Lloyd Webber in Concert*, *Tale of Two Cities the Musical*, *Rock Theatre*, *L.A.
