

About the Producer

She won awards for her three most recent roles: Addie Mae in *The Cover of Life*, Miss Preen in *The Man Who Came to Dinner*, and her first lead, Mama in *I Remember Mama*, directed by Philip Brickey. Phil won an award for directing "Mama" disproving the saying that "nice guys finish last". Margie is very pleased to be working with Phil again and with his talented cast.

About the Designers

Tony Pereslete – Tony has been a member of Kentwood Players for almost three years. He has participated in set design and construction for many productions.

Tom Brophey – Tom's first lighting design was for thriller *Night Watch* in 1974. Since then he has designed the lights for several KP shows, including Philip Brickey's *I Remember Mama*.

Susan Stangl – Susan designed sound at Kentwood for *Forty Carats* and *Don't Dress for Dinner*. She has also acted in several shows at Kentwood and other local theaters. She is currently appearing in *Antigone* at Open Stage West in Sherman Oaks.

Phil Massi – Phil has designed costumes recently for KP's *Forty Carats*, *Father of the Bride*, *Laughter on the 23rd Floor*, and not so recently for *Mame*. Not only has he been playing with us behind the scenes, but also since 1987 has had lead roles in several of our musicals and plays and appeared in KP's Concert Series. He was honored with a Marcom Masque Award as Best Male Lead for his work in the comedy, *Social Security*.

About the Cast

Andrew Fitzsimmons (Thompson, etc) – Finding Andrew barricaded in the dressing room, Philip Brickey was forced to cast him in *Dial M*, which he gracefully accepted. Recently finished with *Kiss Me Kate*, Drew is looking forward to this adventure.

James Knudsen (Tony) – James is honored to be making his debut on the Kentwood Players stage. A native of Tulare, California, James began acting in high school. He received his Master of Fine Arts, in Theatre from Cal State Fullerton in 2001. Among the roles he has performed, Stone in *City of Angels*, Master Geautreaux in *Chained*, and most recently John in *Lips Together, Teeth Apart*, where was the husband of Aileen Scott for the first time. James thanks Aileen, Andrew, David, Phil, Joe and Wynn for their wonderful work. And special thanks to the technical and support players at Kentwood.
