About the Production Staff

Victoria Miller (Director/Choreographer) – Vicki is a 22-year KP member and a performer, choreographer, director, and producer here and at other L.A. venues. Most recently, she directed KP's *City of Angels* and choreographed *1940's Radio Hour*. Dance credits include *Folies Bergere*, Disneyland's *Golden Horseshoe Revue*, the Hollywood Bowl with Gene Kelly and Debbie Reynolds, Merv Griffin TV show and CLOSBC.

Brian Murphy (Musical Director) – Brian recently returned from New York where he music-directed presentations of *Jesus' Kid Brother* at the 42nd St. Theatre. His Equity waiver credits include Sondheim's *Merrily We Roll Along* at the West Coast Ensemble, earning him Backstage West's Garland Award for Music Direction. He reprised his role as music director of *Merrily* for the Reprise! series, starring Teri Hatcher, Jean Louisa Kelly and Stella Stevens.

Patricia Butler and **Ben Lupejkis** (Producers) – Although this is Ben's first time with the checkbook, Pattie has produced a number of cabaret shows and concerts in the Bay area, most notably *La Mome Piaf, Lady and the Sparrow*, and *K*-*r*-*a*-*z*-*y for Gershwin*.

Ben Lupejkis (Set Designer/Decorator) – This is Ben's third design for Kentwood and most ambitious. Past designs were for *Two by Two* and *Murder on the Nile*. Ironically, all three had a boat. He'd like to thank Vicki for this opportunity, but he's too tired.

Richard Potthoff (Lighting and Sound Designer) – Richard is one of Kentwood's resident techies. He received Marcom Masque Awards for *1940's Radio Hour* and *City of Angels*.

Rocky Miller (Sound Designer) – Texas-born, vintage music aficionado, Rocky co-designs sound once again, having previously assisted on *1940's Radio Hour* and *City of Angels*.

Maria Cohen (Costume Designer) – Maria is in charge of wardrobe and costumes for Kentwood Players and has costumed many shows for them. Her credits include musicals, comedies and dramas with a list of awards and accolades.

About the Cast

Phil Apoian (Father Flynn/Ensemble) – Phil has worked in television, film, and theatre, but prefers Shakespeare because "you get to work in tights." He's a proud member of SAG.

Steve Bevins (Broderick/Ensemble) – Steve appeared in Theater Palisades' 2004 production of Cole Porter's *Anything Goes*, winning "Best Cameo Actor." Steve's a songwriter and is currently working on a solo album.

Elizabeth A. Bouton (Molly) – Elizabeth is happy to be back where she was last seen as Gabbi/Bobbi/City of Angels Other notable credits include Penelope Pennywise/Urinetown, Aldonza/La Mancha, Narrator/Joseph and the Amazing, Technicolor Dreamcoat, Baker's Wife/Into the Woods, Sister Mary Amnesia/Nunsense, and Sally Bowles/Cabaret.

Patricia Butler (Grand Duchess/Ensemble) – Pattie performs "for my Ben, the fabulous Mrs. Garcia, and my Vi, who can make any man round 'bouts look like the sissies they is."

Sheldon Cohen (Maestro Gardella/Ensemble) – Sheldon agrees with the old theatre adage that there are no small roles, even if he's only a breathing prop.

Sheridan Cole (Mrs. McGlone) – Sheridan shares her Iowa roots with Meredith Willson, and his music is close to her heart. This is her first mainstage musical with Kentwood. Fun!

Amy Coles (Saloon Girl/Ensemble) – Amy most recently played Lizzie in Theatre Palisades' *Baby*. She graduated from USC with a degree in Music Industry and an emphasis in vocal performance.

Jim Crawford (Burt/Ensemble) – Jim climbed the "ladder" of success to win an award for the *1940's Radio Hour*, which he parlayed into a chance to sing in *Molly Brown*.

Sarah Faith D'Agostino (Saloon Girl/Ensemble) – Sarah has performed in over 30 productions – second time with Vicki, Amy, and roomie/best friend Mahoney. She loves being a S.T.A.R. musical theatre teacher at Warner Elementary.

Drew Fitzsimmons (Roberts/Ensemble) – Drew couldn't be happier returning home to Kentwood with this miracle of a production. A multiple award-winning actor, he's glad to be home. Thanks, Vicki!

Derek Houck (Patrick/Ensemble) – Described by many as the most intense short man ever, Derek recently performed in *Pirates of Penzance* and as Tiny Tom in *Urinetown*.

Stephen Hulsey (Prince/Ensemble) – Stephen makes his Kentwood debut with this show. His previous credits include Sparky, Smudge/Forever Plaid, Padre/ *Man Of La Mancha*, Marcello/*Bohéme*, Rutledge/1776, Giuseppe/Gondoliers, and Charlie Brown/*Charlie Brown*.

Ben Lupejkis (Christmas Morgan/Ensemble) – Ben just portrayed the dynamic, gregarious Sydney Black in *Light Up the Sky*. He has appeared in numerous plays and musicals at Kentwood and beyond.

Sarah Mahoney (Saloon Girl/Ensemble) – Sarah, a native Nebraskan, was last seen in *Banter & Vows*. Look for her in the HBO series *Big Love*. "Thanks to my parents and my best friend Sarah D."

Paul Mazerov (Shamus) – Paul was last seen as Pops Bailey in Kentwood's *The* 1940's *Radio Hour*. He dedicates this performance in memory of his son Allan Mazerov.

Rocky Miller (Johnny) – While he has relished playing tired, sad and lonely, tense, murderous, self-absorbed, clueless, and philandering characters: Stone/*City* of Angels, Cliff/1940's Radio Hour, Sweeney/Sweeney Todd, Fred/Petruchio/Kiss Me, Kate, Pinkerton/Madama Butterfly, and Sheldrake/Promises, Promises, Rocky is honored to portray the essential American character, an optimistic, self-sufficient, honest, true, humble, caring hero. It is a role for which he studied all his life – watching his father.

Michael Murphy (Monsignor Ryan/Ensemble) – Michael was last seen in Kentwood's *Heaven Can Wait*. Other credits include *The Fantasticks*, *Oklahoma!*, and *You're a Good Man*, *Charlie Brown*.

Tina Marie Nigro (Princess/Ensemble) – After numerous roles nationwide in commercials, TV, stage, and film, Tina is thrilled to bring her warmth and passion to her debut performance with KP.

Judy Polak (Grand Duchess Nicholaiovna/Ensemble) – "Thanks, Vicki, for including me in the wonderful show; and thanks, Lee and family, for giving me great joy and confidence."
