Director's Note

Delving into the script of *Dial M for Murder*, one is struck by how well Frederick Knott has crafted this play. Reversing the usual sequence of a mystery, the playwright gives the audience the culprit at the onset and the trill derives from watching the plot unfold. The characters of the play are richly developed and the dialogue is crisp and interesting. Although an iconic part of theatrical and film history, it is hard to believe that initially Mr. Knott had trouble getting this, his first play, produced on the stage and it was first presented on British television. It received critical acclaim and finally made it to the West End stage on June 19, 1952 and to Broadway on October 29, 1952.
