

Director's Note

IF YOU'RE LIKE ME, you get to the theater early, wait for the doors to open, take your seat, look around at the pre-show lighting and set, and then scan the program. Besides seeing bios of the cast and creative team, you may scan the "Synopsis of Scenes" and here you'll find an interesting inclusion by Arthur Miller. He wrote in 1947 "Act I: The Backyard of the Keller home in the outskirts of an American town. *August of our era.*" Even though we set our story specific to Labor Day weekend of 1947, I chose to leave Miller's verbiage because the themes of this play are timeless and current: wealth above humanity, the cost of war for the participants and families, and acceptable, compartmentalized culpability and plausible deniability.

You may have also noted that the entirety of the story takes place in a single day/evening. Greek drama written ages ago still resonates because it explores the motives and machinations of the cleverest of wonders: Man. The unraveling of the frayed fabrics of our existence, when it begins, happens very quickly. It also resonates because, contrary to our protestations, we are hell-bent on pulling the thread. We are fascinated by the tragedies happening around us and thankful we are not involved. We want to know for a fact why the freeway is jammed, why an airplane crashed, why someone dies without warning or reason, or why there's still war, even though we have fashioned and funded the most elaborate defense systems imaginable.

We don't wish to politicize your theatre experience. We wish for you to join us on a journey of faith, faith that we will tell of the human condition truthfully, that we examine in depth the motives of persons wishing to maintain or improve their lives, and that we come out on the other side of this jammed freeway with relief, wonderment, understanding, and thanks, thanks that there but for the grace of....

Enjoy the experience.

Ben Lupejkis - Set Design

All My Sons marks Ben's sixth design for Kentwood Players, having previously designed Two by Two, The Unsinkable Molly Brown (award winner), Murder on the Nile, Sordid Lives, and It's a Wonderful Life: A Radio Play. They say it takes a village to produce a play, and it takes a dedicated team to bring forth a design. He wants to give special thanks to Doug, George, and Lefty for the build of his "Lego" set-within-a-set, redwood fence, and garden furniture. He'd like to thank Jamie for helping throw up paint and creating an arbor of trees. He'd like to thank Tony Pereslete for challenging small stage design and Max Stormes—dearly missed—for his enduring support and vision. Doing double duty is difficult, but if Ben ever had any questions about concept and realization, he had a direct line to the director, as he was constantly in his head and vice versa.

Light Design – Michael Thorpe

Mike has never flown a P-40 before, but he has owned a P-60, which is pretty close. They both crash occasionally, although the P-40 Warhawk's crashes are usually due to engine-block cracks and the Pentium 60's crashes are usually due to buggy software. While owning a P-60 isn't a good qualification for Mike to pilot a P-40, it is a decent qualification for Mike to program the computer controlling the lighting for this production. And he certainly hopes there will not be a crash of any kind during the performance.

Sound Design – Shawn K. Summerer

This is Shawn's third sound design at Kentwood, having previously designed 39 Steps and Mame. Additionally, he has designed and built the sets for 9 to 5: The Musical, California Suite, Young Frankenstein, and Pippin. He has also directed three shows at Kentwood including Dracula in 2010, The Miracle Worker in 2012, and Into the Woods in 2014.
