

## Director's Note

What makes a play a "Classic"? We wouldn't dispute, certainly, that Shakespeare falls into that category, and we'd probably include the great Greek tragedies, as well as Chekhov, lbsen, and Shaw. But, as we move closer to our own time, the distinction gets a little fuzzier.

Plays stand the test of time if they speak to something universal in human behavior. A play that seems as relevant now as the day it was first produced can lay claim to being a Classic.

Noël Coward was one of the great English-language playwrights of the 20th century, and "Private Lives" is one of his most brilliant achievements. It still has the ability to delight us - and provoke us - because (as the kids might say) it's still "relatable."

These past several weeks, as I've described the play - and, in particular, the curious relationship between its protagonists, Elyot and Amanda - to my friends, they've often responded by saying: "Oh, I was in a relationship like that once!" Or: "That happened to a friend of mine!"

Our times are different; we woo and wed differently, but Coward captured something essential and timeless about love and loving. We pull for Amanda and Elyot to get this thing <u>right</u>, even as we acknowledge, as our friend Shakespeare once said: "The course of true love never did run smooth."

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
