#### ABOUT THE DIRECTOR . . .

ROBERT N. TERRY is directing for the fourth time with Kentwood Payers, having directed the first play, MAYBE TUESDAY, in West-chester Playhouse, as well as TWO FOR THE SEESAW, and SEND ME NO FLOWERS. For two of his five acting roles with the group, Bob received the Players' Masque Award. Bob just co-starred in THE DES-ERT RAVEN, a picture which has not yet been released. His most recent stage work was as Polonius in HAMLET, and he has also done reportory with Guy Stockwell in CRIME AND PUNISHMENT and STORY OF POE. He is a member of the Los Angeles Art Theatre.

#### WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST . . .

PATRICK DARREN KENDLEY (Adam Taylor) is appearing for the first time with the Players. He was recently a member of the Film Industry Workshop at Columbia Studios. His two favorite roles were Hal in PICNIC and Sefton in STALAG 17.

ELLEN LEDDY-ARNOLD (Eileen Taylor) last appeared as Josefa in SHOT IN THE DARK, for which role she was nominated for a Player Masque Award. Other Player productions include EVERYBODY LOVES OPAL, THE RED SHOES, PAPA IS ALL, and THE DETECTIVE STORY. Ellen is also currently working professionally with Frankie Avalon in HOW TO STUFF A WILD BIKINI. In the last few years Ellen has acquired several movie and television credits.

MEL OSHINS (Man) joined the Players in the fall of 1961 as the cab driver in HARVEY. Since that time he has played in a variety of roles including Gordon Miller in ROOM SERVICE, and MORESTAN in SHOT IN THE DARK, and parts in THE SHRIKE, LULLABY, and SNOW WHITE. Mel is also active in the Westchester Temple Theatre group.

PAT SLUTSKE (Woman) is appearing onstage with Kentwood Players for the first time. However, in TENTH MAN she acted as script girl, and then handled sound during the run of the play. Prior to coming to Los Angeles Pat was with the University of Chicago Blackfriars; and acted and worked backstage for the Little Theater of Portsmouth and the Summer Sands Playhouse.

ARDEN HEIDE (Mike Mitchell) is another newcomer to the Westchester Playhouse stage, but by no means to little theatre for he has done about 50 shows in stock and community theatre including such vehicles as THE MATCHMAKER, WUTHERING HEIGHTS, CYRANO DE BERGERAC and GIRLS IN 509. Arden is from Sioux Falls, South Dakota and works for Samuel French, Inc., play publishers.

MARTY OLSON (Russell Wilson) comes to the Kentwood stage with a variety of musical and light opera experience with Bluth Bros. Theatre, Long Beach Civic Light Opera, Bay Cities Theatre Association, the UCLA Opera Workshop, Santa Monica Civic Light Opera and Pomona College. Marty is married to an actress and has one small son.
