

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR . . .

KARL THOMAS brings a wealth of talent and experience to this fifth directorial stint for Kentwood. His previous directorial achievements were ABSENCE OF A CELLO, SHOT IN THE DARK, A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM, and THE DRUNKARD, a production for which he was eminently well qualified, having acted professionally in that particular play for more than 15 years with the original Los Angeles company. Karl's song and dance talent was last on display in GUYS AND DOLLS. He has also appeared in many other Kentwood plays, among which were THE FANTASTICKS, DESPERATE HOURS, ROOM SERVICE, THE ODD COUPLE and THE TENTH MAN, for which he won a Masque Award as best minor actor. A long-time member, Karl is a past president of Kentwood and has served numerous terms on the Board of Directors.

ABOUT THE PRODUCER . . .

BO BEAUDOIN has been a member for the past eight years, taking an active part in practically every production since he first became one of our family. Always ready to lend a helping hand whenever asked, BO is one of KP's most talented master-of-all-trades . . . being an accomplished craftsman, sculptor, playwright and comedy writer. He draws from a 20-year background in theatrical arts, having produced and directed more than 40 productions for the U.S. Armed Forces both here and abroad.

ABOUT THE CAST ...

DON GANDALF (Bellhop — Borden Eisler). While being a newcomer to KP, he brings with him a healthy background in theatre arts. He has studied theatre arts and crafts at Nassau Community College in New York, and has acted in GUYS AND DOLLS, MY FAIR LADY, THE UNKNOWN SOLDIER, etc. He is also active, in a technical capacity, with the Armenian Folkloric Dance Ensemble.

ESTHER PRAGER (Karen Nash) and IRV ROSEN (Sam Nash) appearing in this play as husband and wife are actually Mr. and Mrs. in real life. The combined talents and versatility of this couple are so vast that to enumerate them would take up more space than this program allows. Suffice to say . . .

ESTHER has been with KP for more than 15 years during which time she received Masque Awards for her roles in MAJORITY OF ONE, BORN YESTERDAY, AUNTIE MAME, STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE and DETECTIVE STORY. Recently she's been seen locally in BAREFOOT IN THE PARK, DEAR ME THE SKY IS FALLING, and DEER-PARK. Last, but not least, Esther is now President of KP.

IRV, not to be outdone by Esther, has piled up his own awards from KP — namely, for his outstanding performances in A CASE OF LIBEL, RED SHOES, THE TENTH MAN and A THOUSAND CLOWNS. He also lists stage credits for roles in THE ODD COUPLE, SEND ME NO FLOWERS, DETECTIVE STORY and ANUS. And, in addition, he received the Best Actor Award in 1967 from the L.A. County Adult Drama Festival for his role in A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE.

LARRY MONTEZ (Waiter) While new to KP, he has a rich background in theatre arts. Larry studied drama at Wilet College, Indiana University, Theatre Vanguard and The Academy Players Ring. Among his stage credits are roles in BRICK AND THE ROSE, KING AND I, ANNIE GET YOUR GUN, OKLAHOMA, etc.

SHERIDAN COLE (Jean McCormack) While a comparatively new member of KP, Sherdian has an enviable background in theatre arts. She is a drama graduate of the University of Iowa. This is her second appearance on the KP stage. In the past, she appeared at the Cellar Theatre in Hollywood and the Burbank Little Theatre.

HAROLD SRIRO (Jesse Kiplinger) has been a member of KP for the past six years. He is a graduate of the Willy Sutton School of Acting and Theatre Arts. He has played the title role in HARVEY and also won an award for best supporting actor in an original production of AN AMERICAN COUSIN.

SUE BERBER (Muriel Tate) is a long time member of KP. This talented actress appeared on our stage in the following productions: MAYBE TUESDAY, TWO FOR THE SEE SAW, MIGHTY MAN IS HE, SHOT IN THE DARK, TENTH MAN, etc. Sue also played in DEAR ME THE SKY IS FALLING at the Westside Jewish Community Center.

EDYTHE SILLS (Norma Hubley) continues her remarkable record of achievement not only as an actress but as a director and writer. She directed the never-to-be-forgotten production of GUYS AND DOLLS. She is the winner of many acting awards at KP and elsewhere, the most recent being the 1970 Masque Award as best actress for her role as Eleanor in THE LION IN WINTER (for which she also received the best actress award from the L.A. County Adult Drama Festival), and the 1970 Masque Award for best supporting actress for her work in READY WHEN YOU ARE C.B. Her other awards were for AUNTIE MAME, DARK AT THE TOP OF THE STAIRS, ROSE TATTOO, HARVEY, THE SHRIKE, LULLABY, etc., etc., etc.

MURRAY WEISSFELD (Roy Hubley) is one of our very own. His versatility as an actor runs the gamut from A to Z in rib-tickling comedy and serious drama. He is the recipient of KP Masque Awards for roles in FANTASTICKS, A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM, AUNTIE MAME, etc. In addition to these, he received the L.A. County Drama Festival Award for his performance in COME BLOW YOUR HORN.

LISA LYONS (Mimsey) While too young to become a member of KP, Lisa shows a great deal of talent for the theatre. This is her second appearance on our stage . . . her last being in the Kentwood Special production of OUR TOWN.
