## About the Cast . . .

BENNY GOODMAN (Eddie, the Superintendent) This versatile performer is a welcome recent addition to our company of players, and last trod the Kentwood stage in ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST; other appearances locally include AN ITALIAN STRAW HAT, A BAD YEAR FOR TOMATOES and DRACULA. Benny hails from Louisiana and makes his living as a commercial artist.

ELAINE GROSSMAN (the Pregnant Woman) This role marks Elaine's debut appearance on any stage in a continuing production. As a native-born New Yorker she brings an instinct for our particular show, honed in dramatic and comedy improvisational workshops at UCLA, among others. She joined us in 1975, when her nieces Michelle and Danielle appeared in THE SOUND OF MUSIC.

JOHN GREEN (the Expectant Father) Although this is John's initial Kentwood performances as an actor, he is no stranger to our theatre, having played drums in the musicals CARNIVAL and CABARET; previous acting experience includes a number of plays during his school days. John recalls with pride that his mother Verna Mae Green was one of the founders of Kentwood Players, over 25 years ago.

CAREN HERZBERGER (Anne Miller) Caren's bounteous talents have been unceasingly evident since she first joined our theatre about four years ago. In addition to acting in productions such as CATCH ME IF YOU CAN, NEVER TOO LATE and FORTY CARATS (the latter won her an acting award), she has also served as co-producer, script supervisor, and currently holds the office of secretary on our Board of Directors. Some of her other acting credits include THE PATRIOTS, BUTTERFLIES ARE FREE, COME BLOW YOUR HORN and ENTER LAUGHING. JIM BEAM (Paul Friedman) When not involved in teaching for area high schools (during a four-year stint at Morningside his students presented six full productions a yearl), this actor has been compiling substantial credits around Los Angeles. Jim has appeared in Glendale Center's BAREFOOT IN THE PARK and COME BLOW YOUR HORN, and Group Repertory productions of THE GOOD DOCTOR, END OF SUMMER and BORN YESTERDAY.

HELEN GELLER (the Woman in 4A) Helen's first Kentwood appearance was in last year's hit production of THE PRISONER OF SECOND AVE-NUE. No newcomer to the stage, her impressive credentials include key roles in MINNIE'S BOYS, CAROUSEL and DON'T DRINK THE WATER, to name just a few. Her very first experience as a performer was on a weekly children's radio program with her twin brother in their home town of Rochester, New York.

TERRY KOVAC (Richard Miller) It has been over a year since Terry's last appearance here in the powerful ANDERSONVILLE TRIAL, and his return is a most welcome one for our current production. His versatility is apparent, with prior major roles in such varied plays as THE NIGHT THOREAU SPENT IN JAIL, ANTIGONE, BUS STOP and THE BOYS IN THE BAND.

DONA COULTICE (Janet Friedman) Dona's premier Kentwood appearance in 6 RMS RIV VU adds to her notable local credits in THE FAN-TASTICKS and STAR-SPANGLED GIRL. However, her theatre work doesn't stop with acting; she has also choreographed numerous South Bay productions such as ROAR OF THE GREASEPAINT, CAME-LOT, THE FANTASTICKS and STOP THE WORLD, I WANT TO GET OFF. Actually, her introduction to our theatre came through her own young daughter; seven-year-old J'aime appeared just last season in CAT ON A HOT TIN ROOF.
