

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

TONI MILLER is directing her second play for KP with this current production. Prior to this she directed CHAPTER TWO and has produced our presentations of THE RUNNER STUMBLES, THE HOT L BALTIMORE, THE PRISONER OF SECOND AVENUE, ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST and UPROAR IN THE HOUSE. She has appeared on our stage as Aunt Ev in THE MIRACLE WORKER, Sister Sophia in THE SOUND OF MUSIC, Nettie in THE SUBJECT WAS ROSES and Nurse Ratched in ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST. Toni is on the KP Board of Directors and is Chairperson of our annual Masque Awards Dinner Dance. Before joining KP nine years ago, she appeared in and produced several plays for the Conejo Players in Thousand Oaks.

ABOUT THE PRODUCER

BARBARA SILLIMAN has been a member of Kentwood since she was Costume Coordinator for THE DIARY OF ANNE FRANK. She was last seen on Kentwood's stage as April Green in THE HOT L BALTIMORE for which she won a Masque Award. Her first producing assignment was last year's highly successful CHAPTER TWO, which was also her first teaming with director Toni Miller. She and Toni have again joined forces with this production of ROMANTIC COMEDY, and plan to equal if not surpass their previous success. Barbara has also appeared as an actress in numerous plays in the Northeast and was seen as Goat's Ma in The Robber Bridegroom in Los Angeles.

ABOUT THE ASSISTANT TO THE PRODUCER

LINDA REUSCH has been actively involved in Kentwood for just over one year. She had a small role in last season's musical GYPSY, and has worked backstage for the Kentwood productions of CHAPTER TWO, COME BACK LITTLE SHEBA, GYPSY, MY THREE ANGELS, THREE MAN ON A HORSE, and THE OWL AND THE PUSSYCAT. She is finally coming out from backstage and moving up . . . to the light booth . . . as well as learning production techniques as assistant to the producer. We hope to see Linda producing plays for us in the near future.

ABOUT THE CAST

JAMES K. BEAM (Jason Carmichael) last appeared at Kentwood as Father Rivard in THE RUNNER STUMBLES, and before that, in 6 RMS RIV VU. He has appeared in over 50 productions at such theatres as the Glendale Centre Theatre and the Group Repertory Theatre. Last year in Los Angeles he appeared in Barefoot In The Park, The Murder of Peter Pan, and The Ghost Sonata. James has been featured in many student, educational, religious and industrial films, television, and movies including MacArthur, The Sam Sheppard Murder Case, Fireball Forward, Mae West's Sextette, and episodes of the TV series Planet of the Apes.

EUGENIA DeLUCCA (Phoebe Craddock) has returned to the stage after an 8 year hiatus with this production of ROMANTIC COMEDY. She has trained with many well-known coaches in Los Angeles, including Guy Stockwell, Rudy Solari, and Lee Strasberg. She has appeared in several films and TV productions including the Roger Corman Production of Capone, and television episodes of The Bold Ones, Colombo, Owen Marshall, The FBI, and Faith For Today. Her theatre credits include Picnic, A Flea in Her Ear, Barefoot in the Park, and The Indian Takes The Bronx. We hope she will continue with us in future Kentwood productions.

MICHELLE ROSEN (Blanche Dailey) is a past president of Kentwood Players and last appeared on our stage in CALIFORNIA SUITE. Her theatrical training includes classes at LACC and on-the-job training at Kentwood. She produced A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM, Kentwood's first musical. Michelle appeared on our stage in NORMAN IS THAT YOU?, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF, ANNE OF A THOUSAND DAYS, PRISONER OF SECOND AVENUE (Masque Award), A MAJORITY OF ONE (Masque Award), AUNTIE MAME (Masque Award), BORN YESTERDAY (Masque Award), and A STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE (Masque Award). She is a 26-year member of our company and has served on the Board of Directors as Membership Chairman, Workshop Chairman, and Plays Committee Chairman.

GARRETT NICHOLS (Leo Janowitz) is joining Kentwood with this production. He received his training at the Uta Hagen-Herbert Berghof Studios in New York. Garrett has appeared in such New York productions as The Candidate, Street Scene, and The Lesson, and at Boston's Loeb Theatre in Waiting for Godot. Here in Los Angeles he has been seen in El Camino Real, Time Step, The Party, and most recently at the Westside Repertory Theatre in The Shadow Box. We look forward to a long and active relationship with this gifted actor.

BEVERLY ALDEN (Allison St. James) is a welcome new addition to Kentwood. She has studied with the Lee Strasberg Institute, the South Coast Repertory, Film Industry Workshops, and various private coaches. Some of Beverly's theatre credits in Orange County include Bianca in The Taming of the Shrew, Laura James in Look Homeward Angel, and Lorraine Sheldon in The Man Who Came to Dinner. her past five years have been spent performing in comedy/melodramas at Knott's Berry Farm's Birdcage Theatre. We hope to see more of her in future productions at Kentwood.

BERNYCE GREEN (Kate Mallory) graced our stage once before during her 3 year membership when she portrayed Phyllis in FOLLIES. Her theatrical experience encompasses several plays in the Los Angeles and San Francisco areas including Pajama Game, Guys and Dolls, My Fair Lady, Anastasia, Bell Book and Candle, I Am A Camera, Guest in the House, and All The King's Men.
