ABOUT THE PRODUCERS ...

HARVEY ERLICH - Harvey has been active with Kentwood since joining more than eleven years ago. He has appeared on our stage in STEAMBATH and TWELVE ANGRY MEN. CAROL ANN KUBIK - AN ALMOST PERFECT PERSON is Carol's debut for Kentwood, however she has performed extensively for the past fifteen years. JACQUES LA CERTE - Jacques La Certe is not new to Kentwood. He is a co-founder and director of the Los Angeles Classic Repertory Theatre Company. He has been a drama coach for Agnes Moorhead, Lurene Tuttle and Actor Workshop in Hollywood.

PETE L'ANGELLE - Pete has worked as a guitarist/singer in clubs, hotels and casinos in Las Vegas, Reno and Lake Tahoe. He has been seen in the title role in Jimmy Shine and as Doc in Crimes of the Heart. Pete has studied with Lee Strasberg, Joseph Bernard and Lorraine Hull.
