# Director's Note

Welcome to the world premiere production of *Little Green Men*. This is the first time in almost 60 years that the Kentwood Players have presented a full-length original musical comedy, and I hope it will be the first of more to come in the future. I wrote this musical because I've always been a fan of the Orson Welles' "War of the Worlds" broadcast and I wanted to create a family show that could be done at Halloween.

However, writing a good show and getting it onto paper – or flash drive – is merely half the battle for an ambitious playwright and composer. Informal readings for friends and colleagues only provide limited feedback and critique. A play or musical written for the stage isn't fully realized until it's presented in front of a live audience of curious theatregoers who have chosen to invest their time and money to experience something brand new to their eyes and ears – as all of you have chosen to do right now. The enthusiastic response of a live audience – or lack thereof – is the best indication to an author as to whether all the hard work and agony has been worth it.

Every single piece ever written for the theatre, be it beloved hit or instant flop, began somewhere, sometime, as a "world premiere." And the Kentwood Players have chosen Little Green Men to be your first experience of an original work at the Westchester Playhouse. I am grateful beyond words to the Kentwood Board and Play Reading Committee for giving me the opportunity and creative freedom to share my new musical with you. Please let us know what you think, and perhaps more original works by Kentwood member/writers will appear on this stage very soon.

# The "Real-Life" Story Behind Little Green Men Considered one of the greatest Halloween pranks of all time!



On Sunday evening, October 30, 1938, 23-year-old Orson Welles presented the radio play *Invasion From Mars* written by Howard Koch. Performed by members of Welles' Mercury Theatre Company, the program was inspired by H.G. Wells' *War of the Worlds* and is still considered one of the greatest Halloween pranks of all time.

The radio program began with an announcement that the broadcast that followed was a presentation by Welles and his actors. After the disclaimer, a musical performance of Bernard Herrmann conducting the CBS orchestra began, and

suddenly, the first of several news bulletins interrupted the music. People weren't accustomed to "documentary re-creations" and were certain these bulletins were real. Plus, Americans were already on edge as the daily reports about the war in Europe were increasingly grim.

As the descriptions of "Martian invaders" became more horrific, thousands of people phoned their newspapers and local police to ask what they should do to avoid them. In New Jersey, families tied wet cloths over their faces to escape the "gas attack," and piled into their cars and clogged traffic for miles. A woman in Pittsburgh screamed "I'd rather die this way" and was barely prevented from taking poison. At the end of the show, most listeners were apparently too frightened to hear a chuckling Welles sign off by saying, "If your doorbell rings and nobody's there, that was no Martian . . . it's Halloween."

So, how could so many people be fooled by this Halloween prank? Most people were listening to Charlie McCarthy and tuned into Orson Welles' broadcast a little too late to hear the disclaimer. And the rest, as they say, is history.

# Did you remember the incident? Kentwood Members sound off!

**Max Heldring Stormes** was a young child in Maine when the show aired. He said there wasn't much to do in his small town but sit in front of the radio. However, on that night, he was at a Halloween party, so he didn't hear it. He did share that he "knew it was fictitious – they made announcements beforehand that they were going to broadcast it, and a disclaimer was played as it began. A few days later, when I heard the reaction, I couldn't believe all of New Jersey went ape about it."

As an 11-year-old at the time, **Charlotte Lee Schildkret** said that her family was not taken in by it. "My parents couldn't believe how people could get fooled by it. The next day, all the conversations were about the people who thought it was real, as well as what a genius Orson Welles was."



**Sheldon Metz** wasn't around at the time of the broadcast, but was Orson Welles' make-up artist for commercials and industrial films for three years. When asked if Mr. Welles mentioned anything about the broadcast, he noted, "we talked about many things including the show. It was a big party. Everyone was having fun and no one knew or suspected the reaction. They were slightly embarrassed when they started getting calls and wires started coming in!"



**Dave Parke** was also not around when the broadcast was aired, but knows it intimately. "I have the original broadcast on a record. My mom had it too, and we used to listen to it over and over again for years. It was terrifying if you didn't know it was fake – and we would always have that in our heads as we listened. And every time the movie would come on TV, we would beg our mom to let us watch it, no matter what day or time it was!"

Now retired and living in Palm Springs, **Jack Lyons** played the 'CBS Lead Announcer,' in addition to several other voices, in a production of "War of the Worlds" at the Groves Cabin Theatre in Morongo Valley last October. "I actually heard the broadcast sitting in front of my parent's old Silvertone radio in our living room. Did I realize what I was hearing was an actual 'news broadcast?' I doubt it. I probably thought it was just another radio show my family listened to at night. But, boy, did we all hear about it in the newspapers and radio news shows all the next week. Even the kids at school were talking about the hoax. But I don't think we kids really understood the importance and impact of what Orson Welles and his Mercury Theatre of the Air Players accomplished. One thing emerged from the incident: I decided I wanted to be a radio actor, or at least work in radio. Who would have thunk it that 68 years later, I would actually be a cast member of a production that recreated the 1938 broadcast?!"


