

# **Director's Thoughts**

I'm reading a synopsis of The 39 Steps and it runs on to four pages of squinty type face, and I think...mmm, busy. Then I look at a timeline of how many times the original source material has been dramatized on film, radio, or dramatic reading, sixteen, and I think...mmmm, popular. Then I heard the positive buzz about this tongue-in-cheek incarnation that you'll see our version of tonight, and I think...mmmm, right up my alley. Hitchcock, a personal favorite for many years since Eva Marie Saint and Cary Grant shared an upper berth in North by Northwest, fashioned a gripping, albeit action-packed spy thriller in 1935 from Scottish novelist John Buchan's 1915 series of books centered around the adventures of Canadian-born diplomat, Richard Hannay. Of course, Hitch included just the right number of beautiful ladies, a raft of heavies and henchmen, a confused constabulary, and a delicious villain (and his wife), and kept audiences on the edge of theirs seats for the original and the remakes to follow. Our version maintains the thrill, but has the added bonus and danger of non-stop, laughing off of your backsides comedy, which includes all the characters of the original film assayed by four extremely talented actors. What a challenge to find the right mix of actor and comedian, and to find four matching parts: the perfect set. What a challenge to give them a head of steam, only to have to dampen their enthusiasm in order to tell a cogent story. What a challenge to have to present multiple locales at break neck speed on Kentwood's postage stamp sized cozy stage. This project has been an intense labor, one with which I have fallen in love, like an old friend who one day surprises you, causing your emotions to grow from affection to love. I hope you love our presentation, as much as I have labored and loved helming this remarkable offering.

**Patricia Butler** (Clown 2) – Patricia is thrilled to return to her straight play roots, having been seen most recently in the musicals *Oliver!*, *Candide*, *Parade*, *Working*, *Drood*, *Most Happy Fella*, *Follies*, *1940's Radio Hour*, and *Kiss Me*, *Kate!* No stranger to plays without music, she studied acting extensively at Smith College and the Actors' Conservatory Theatre. She performed the Queen in Genet's *The Blacks* in L.A., and was Lulu in *Pandora's Box* in San Francisco. She honed her acting chops portraying seven characters in Bertolt Brecht's *The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui*, many different roles, but not nearly the thirteen she will be performing for you in *The 39* 

*Steps*. Additionally, she was the creator and played Edith Piaf in her award winning one-woman show, *La Mome Piaf*. She extends sincere gratitude to Ben for his confidence in her ability to navigate the broad spectrum of characters in this show, to Lori and Tony for their friendship and loyalty, and to Frank, Shaina, and Karl for the nightly thrill ride.



Shaina Zalma Ostroff (Pamela/Annabella/Margaret) – Shaina is so glad to be back with the team at Kentwood Players. She was last seen here as Thelma in *The Farndale Ave...Murder Mystery*. She is grateful to Ben for this opportunity, thrilled to be part of a show she so thoroughly enjoyed as an audience member, and honored to be working with such a talented cast and crew. Some past favorite roles in addition to *Farndale*, include Claire in *Rumors*, Mary Shelley in an original Frankenstein play, Mrs. Tottendale in *Drowsy Chaperone*, Woman in *I Love You, You're Perfect Now Change*, and

Louisa in *The Fantasticks*. She wants to thank her wonderful parents, family, friends and loving husband Marc Ostroff for all their love and support.



Karl Schott (Clown 1) – You might remember Karl as the Marcom Masque Award winner as Herbie in *Gyspy*. A classically trained actor, Karl was last seen as Estragon in *Waiting for Godot* and Alibius in *The Changeling*. Other part include, Freddy in *Picassio at the Lapin Agile*, Oscar in *The Odd Couple*, Elwood in *Harvey*, Cassio in *Othello*, Barnard in *Sexual Perversity*, Capt. Jack in *The Rivals*, Jaques in *As You Like It*, Max and Sanders in *Lend Me A Tenor* (for which he was given WCT Best Actor Award). But Karl still finds himself on the Musical stage as he just finished up being Hines in *The Pajama Game* and Luther Billis in *South Pacific* (both Downey CLO) Biggley in *How to* 

Succeed..., Senex in ...Forum; Plus My Fair Lady, Singin' the Rain & Cole. Karl spent 2 years playing the part of Wally in the European and Far East tours of The 1940s Radio Hour. Then another year in Scotland & London with the California Repertory Company that performed many times at Edinburgh Fringe Festival. As a member of the LA Connection and founding member of 3 other improv groups, he's been privileged to have performed at the Comedy Store, The Improv's & be the last act of the LA Playboy club. He is still madly in love with lovely wife Minerva who played his newlywed wife in Barefoot in the Park 13 years ago.



**Frank Weidner** (Hannay) – Frank Weidner is delighted to be making his second appearance in a Kentwood Players show, after playing Candide last year. Frank's favorite thing in the world is saying and doing silly things in front of bunches of people, so he would like to thank everyone in his life who makes that a regular possibility. You know who you are.

#### **About the Director**

Ben Lupejkis (Director) – Ben is a Marcom Masque award winner in front and behind the scenes. His last directorial stint, helming *Parade* in 2011, produced multiple awards, including best production and best director for Ben. A graduate of VA Tech (BA in Theatre) and USCD (MFA in Drama), Ben brings over 39 years of experience to this project, starting his directorial career with Anton Chekov's naturalistic comedy *The Boor* in southeast Virginia as part of an evening of one acts. Since then he has directed original works, lost plays, and multiple concert and main stage shows for Kentwood, notably, *The Most Happy Fella* (2006). He owes his ability to root out comedy from a phone book to his acting and directing coach Simm Landres, who taught him to search for truth in any performance, and to his acting teacher at UCSD, world-renowned director Alan Schneider, for making him act as a paper clip (not like one but as one: "find the properties; find the essence"). "Thanks to theatre for introducing me to Pattie; to Pattie for being my everpresent guiding light; the skippers, Lori and Toni, my talented team, and this comically truthful ensemble, ready to take you on a most theatrical journey. Enjoy our ride that begins with one step and ends with 39. A bargain at twice the price, am I right!"

# **About the Upcoming Shows**

**Ragtime** is the quintessential American musical that won several Tony Awards in 1998. It paints a powerful portrait of life at the turn of the century. Three stories are woven together that poignantly illustrate the struggle Americans faced dealing with class, race, money and justice in a country still struggling to find balance as they moved from the 19<sup>th</sup> to the 20<sup>th</sup> century. It was a tumultuous time when immigrants were looking to find hope in America, when former slaves and their children, now freed, were trying to establish their hold on the American dream, and the white upper middle class society struggled to maintain their lifestyle and expectations. Intertwined with the fictional characters are historical figures including Harry Houdini, Evelyn Nesbit, Harry K. Thaw, Stanford White, Emma Goldman, Henry Ford, Booker T. Washington, and J.P. Morgan.

California Suite explores four human dramas to comical ends, all taking place in a suite at the posh Beverly Hills Hotel. In the Visitor from New York, the divorced couple of Bill and Hannah Warren have rented the suite in order to have a discussion about who will get the custody of their child. In the Visitor from Philadelphia, Marvin Michaels tries frantically and unsuccessfully to explain the situation to his wife when she catches him in flagrante delicto with a hooker in their suite. In the Visitors from London, Sidney Cochran and Diana Barrie are a hilarious pair of Hollywood stars who have rented the suite to await their "date of convenience" appearance at the Academy Awards. The Visitors from Chicago are two affluent couples who are best friends and have brought their families to Beverly Hills for a vacation which takes on a nightmarish tone after a mixed double tennis match.

**Lend Me a Tenor** is a comedy about the Cleveland Opera Company who has booked the renowned tenor Tito Merelli, known to his fans as "Il Stupendo," to sing the lead in *Otello* at their gala fundraiser. Unfortunately, even before the star leaves his hotel room, everything begins to unravel. Chaos ensues when Merelli's wife, who has mistaken an autograph-seeker hidden in his closet for a secret lover, leaves him and the distraught tenor accidentally is given a double dose of tranquilizers to calm him and passes out. Saunders, the opera company's General Manager, is determined that the show will go on, so he asks his assistant Max to impersonate the opera star. What follows is a chain-reaction of mistaken identity, plot twists, farcical double entendres, innuendos, and constant entrances and exits through many doors leading from one comical situation to another!

**Little Shop of Horrors** is a comedy rock musical based on the 1960 science-fiction comedy film by Roger Corman about a hapless florist shop worker named Seymour who raises a man-eating plant he calls "Audrey." The music, composed by Alan Menken in the style of early 1960s rock and roll, doo-wop, and early Motown, includes several well-known tunes, including the title song, "Skid Row (Downtown)," "Somewhere That's Green," and "Suddenly, Seymour." The musical was also made into a 1986 film of the same name, directed by Frank Oz.
