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About the Cast





Director's Note

Playwright Don Nigro invites the audience to explore the play and murder investigation through the eyes and mind of Inspector Ruffing. The rather unusual set reflects both the mind and the subconscious of the detective. Although he may be interviewing only one woman at a time in the master's study, the other "suspects" are always lurking in his subconscious, so they never leave the stage but remain as a rather hazy image in the background. When they move into the light, they move to the forefront of Ruffing's consciousness.

Nigro is also interested in putting a new slant on the popular English murder mystery genre where all the loose ends are neatly tied up at the end. He feels the human mind, like an old house, is a labyrinth full of mystery and surprise, and that the exploration of all these twists and turns in the story are more compelling than the final answer itself. So enjoy the twists and turns.
