Director's Note

"To dream the impossible dream"—those lyrics were first heard in New York City at the ANTA Theatre in 1965. Sung by Richard Kiley, who went on to win the Tony, the story of Man of La Mancha is as inspirational today as it was during the tumultuous 1960s. During that period in America, our belief and faith in our political system was tested by the assassination of John F. Kennedy, the attempt to end segregation, and the escalation of the Vietnam War. The story of a mad knight who in his heart knows that we are better than we ourselves believe is a struggle we experienced then and now. As the 21st century begins to take shape, we are still at odds with our national idealism as we face a presidential election amidst the fear of terrorism and racism, still in the forefront of our experience.

It is fitting that Cervantes' satirical novel written in the early 1600s and set during the Spanish Inquisition would give us Man of La Mancha as conceived by Dale Wasserman, Mitch Leigh and Joe Darion. As one critic said, "Man of La Mancha has a heart that sings and a spirit that soars." Don Quixote entreats us to enter into his imagination. His spiritual philosophy is as timely today as when it was conceived—to leave the world in a better place than we found it and to always reach for the stars.

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
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
