

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR . . .

MONTY ASH is an actor, writer, producer and director. What else can we ask of this fabulous man? A native of England, Monty brings a lifetime of theatrical experience to our stage. His career began when he was a child in English pantomimes. He attended the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts and has been active in the theatre ever since. Both coasts of the United States have been fortunate to view his talents. In 1967 he directed A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE for K.P. and later the play was entered in the Los Angeles County Drama Festival, for which he won the best director award. Some of his other directorial credits were A CASE OF LIBEL and TORCHBEARERS. Monty produced and acted in DON'T DRINK THE WATER and BEST MAN. As a lighting director, we must remember some of his best: MAN OF LA MANCHA, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF and TORCHBEARERS. He was last seen as the Rabbi in FIDDLER ON THE ROOF. In 1973 he directed INHERIT THE WIND.

ABOUT THE PRODUCER AND DESIGNER . . .

MAX HELDRING STORMES was a scenic designer, artist and technical director at the Old Globe Theatre in San Diego. He was on the production staff and also was a co-producer of the American Playwrights Forum in New York City. Max first produced and designed for Kentwood in RASHOMON in 1972. He designed MAN OF LA MANCHA and CAMELOT for K.P. and is a past Production Manager for Kentwood.

ABOUT THE CAST . . .

DAVID MIZRAHI (Joe Keller) is a 14-year member of K.P. and was on the Board of Directors. He appeared most recently in the special production of DARK SOUL OF THE GENTLE SEX. In September of last season he was seen in THE DEVIL'S ADVOCATE. He won the best actor award at the 1967 Adult Drama Festival for his dramatic role in VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE. Dave has appeared in scores of K.P. productions, including DARK AT THE TOP OF THE STAIRS, BORN YESTERDAY, GUYS AND DOLLS and DETECTIVE STORY. He has appeared in community theatres in Southern California and has directed many K.P. productions. Has appeared in community theatre in PLAY IT AGAIN SAM.

DIA KAY (Kate Keller), a Board Member for many years, is currently K.P. vice-president and plays committee chairman. She has appeared on Los Angeles stages for the past twenty years. Dia has been a member of K.P. since 1953, when she first appeared in ANNA LUCASTA. For her 1967 appearance in VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE, she won the Gilmore Brown Award, Adult Drama Festival Award and K.P. Masque Award for most outstanding actress. Dia won another K.P. Masque Award for her role as Lady Alice in MAN FOR ALL SEASONS. She was last seen as Nina Sanduzzi in THE DEVIL'S ADVOCATE last season at K.P. Other credits for Dia include PHILADELPHIA HERE I COME, MEDEA, BEST MAN, DEATH OF A SALESMAN, AWAKE AND SING and THE WOMEN.

BRIAN BLASHAW (Chris Keller) first appeared on the Kentwood stage as King Arthur in CAMELOT. He won the best actor award in 1971 for DETECTIVE STORY. Brian received his degree from Loyola University and has studied at U.S.C. Other credits for him include WEST SIDE STORY, PLAY IT AGAIN SAM, PHILADELPHIA HERE I COME and SOUND OF MUSIC.

JAYNE HAMIL (Ann Deever) is a new member of K.P. and we welcome her with all of her talent. She was a member of the 1971 ensemble of the Pacific Conservatory of Performing Arts in Santa Maria. Jayne was a student at the Musical Comedy Workshop and has been seen in many productions, including STOP THE WORLD I WANT TO GET OFF, LITTLE MARY SUNSHINE, LOOK HOMEWARD ANGEL, FANTASTICKS, LION IN WINTER and TWELFTH NIGHT.

MAX HELDRING STORMES (George Deever) studied drama at San Diego State College, Geller Showcase in Los Angeles and the Mobile Theatre in New York. A member of K.P. for over six years, his name often appears several times in the same production. Max is responsible for our current program cover and has been seen at K.P. in MAN FOR ALL SEASONS, TORCHBEARERS, LOOK HOMEWARD ANGEL, INHERIT THE WIND and a one-night stand as the medium in RASHOMON.

JIM OLIPHANT (Dr. Jim Bayliss) first appeared on the K.P. stage in INHERIT THE WIND. He has an extensive background in theatre arts, having worked on plays on both the east and west coasts as well as productions in Dhahran and Saudi Arabia in the Far East. Some of Jim's acting credits include MARY MARY, MY THREE ANGELS, AH WILDERNESS, ROMAN CANDLE, HARVEY and EXIT THE BODY.

JOSEPHINE MARTIN (Sue Bayliss) is a newcomer to Kentwood. A theatre arts student at the University of Nebraska, she double majored in English and speech. Josephine has been in more than a score of major production throughout Southern California and Nebraska. A few of her credits are RING AROUND THE KING, GOLD IN THE HILLS, STRANGE BEDFELLOWS, MARY OF SCOT-LAND and DIAL M FOR MURDER. Welcome to K.P., Josephine.

HARVEY JAY ROSENBERG (Frank Lubev) is a dedicated veteran member of K.P. with more than a hundred theatre arts skills to his credit. Besides being a very good actor, he is a scenic artist, a stage manager and he constructed the set for last year's INHERIT THE WIND. All the lobby coming attractions signs are Harvey's works of art. He has also designed many of our program covers. His acting credits include ODD COUPLE, WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION, OF MICE AND MEN, NO BODY LOVES AN ALBATROSS, GUYS AND DOLLS, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF and SIGNPOST TO MURDER.

HOLLY FORSMAN (Lydia Lubey) is a newcomer to L.A. and the Kentwood stage. She received her theatre arts training in Ventura County. Holly has done numerous costume designs and was an assistant director and stage manager. Some of her acting credits include LITTLE MARY SUNSHINE, THE SUBJECT WAS ROSES and CHARLIE'S AUNT. Welcome to K.P., Holly. We hope to see more of you.

TODD TURQUAND (Bert) is nine years old and studies guitar and drama as well and singing and dancing with the Showtimers. He has played football on a Pop Warner team for the past two years and received two outstanding citizen awards at school in addition to serving as president of his third grade class. Todd is appearing on the K.P. stage for the first time and was last seen as Winthrop in MUSIC MAN and earned excellent reviews for his performance.
