

LEWIS HAUSER - (Director) Lew has directed numerous plays around the LA area. At Kentwood: Musical Comedy Murders of 1940 (Best Director Award), Legends, Dames At Sea. At Morgan-Wixson: Broadway Bound. At Theatre Palisades: Charly's Aunt (Best Production), The Boy Friend, Witness For The Prosecution, Our Town. Lew was Director-In-Residence for the Queen Mary Dinner Playhouse where he staged "Accomodations" and "Luv" starring Huntz Hall and Gabe Dell. He also staged Musical Comedy Murders of 1940 in Palos

CHRISTINA CAPITO - (Assistant Director) Christina received her A.A. in theatre from SMC and a B.A. in Cinema-Television at USC. Stage Managing credits include Zorba, Catch Me If You Can, El Cid and Broadway Bound. This is her first production at Westchester Playhouse.

LYNNE INGRAM - (Producer) "Tenor" marks Lynne's third outing as a producer for Kentwood Players and her sixth mainstage show with Lew Hauser. Her last project for KP was last year's Rumors which she directed. Her design work in this show is a tribute to her father, Keith. As always he has provided "divine" inspiration.

LAURIE A. LEVY - (Assistant Producer) Laurie joined KP in 1993 and has been pressed into service ever since. She "hung out" for Cemetery Club, assisted with Cabaret, helped direct Rumors, and now she is helping to produce. Versatility is her forte'.

ABOUT THE CAST (in alphabetical order)

Verdes

JAZ DAVISON (Maria) Previously seen in her award winning role of "Bernice" in Palos Verdes Players' Musical Comedy Murders of 1940. A former member of West End Theatre Group, she produced their last show at the Odyssey Theatre in 1993. This is her second production with Lew. She has her sanity hearing after the run.

PAT LACH (Julia) Pat happily makes her Kentwood Players debut. A singer from the cradle, musical theatre introduced her to "the boards." She has actually sung in operatic productions. Southland audiences have applauded her non-singing roles: a fiesty Pauline, No, No, Nanette, an imperious Mrs. Harcourt, Anything Goes and a ditsy Mrs. Upson, Mame.

BRET SHEFTER (Max) Bret recently received the Santa Monica Theatre Guild's 1993 Geoffrey Award for Best Actor for his performance as Ko-Ko in The Mikado. Other roles have included Jack in The Importance of Being Earnest, Pippin in Pippin, and Bud Frump in How To Succeed in Business Without Really Trying.

JOHN VINCENT (Saunders) John began his career in San Francisco. After touring dinner theatres for five years, he settled in southern California where he has appeared in theatres from Los Angeles to San Diego. He has appeared in Norman Is That you, Last Of The Red Hot Lovers, Dylan, Gypsy, The Devil's Advocate and Hello Dolly.

ROM WATSON (Tito Merelli) Rom played the role of Pirelli in the 1988 production of Stephen Sondheim's Sweeney Todd at Santa Monica College. Other roles include Ali Hakim in Oklahoma!, Mr. Snow in Carousel, Greg in A Chorus Line, Gupta in The Indian Wants the Bronx, and Harold Gorringe in Black Comedy. Rom is married to Cory Watson and studies voice with Donald Eaholtz. Of Hawaiian and Swedish descent, "Rom" is his real name, and it isn't short for anything.

WHITNEY WESTON (Diana) Whitney is the founder of the theatre company New Attitude Productions. Her last production was Porch at the Santa Monica Playhouse. Whitney's television and film credits include lead roles in the NBC pilot Instant Recall, ABC Movie of the Week Heroes of Desert Storm and the feature film "Professional Affair."

MELINDA ZOMMICK (Maggie) Melinda's performances include roles in Steel Magnolias and Diary of Anne Frank. Maggie gives Melinda the opportunity to play a role other than Lucy in You're A Good Man Charlie Brown which she's played three times now.
