Samantha Barrios (Sally Applewhite) – Samantha is thrilled to be back at Kentwood after all this time. You may remember her as the loveable Maggie from Lend Me a Tenor. About the Cast



Sally Applewhite (Mary and young Mary) is thrilled to be back in the city at WBFR performing with this talented and beautiful cast. Some of her favorite roles include Missy in *That's Not My Kind of Comedy* and Molly Bird in *Oh dear, Not Another One*. She would like to thank the director of *It's a Wonderful Life* for the opportunity to bring cheer and love into people's homes inspiring world peace with this touching show.



Freddie Filmore (Potter, announcer and others) Freddie was born in a log cabin in upstate Rhode Island. The last of twelve children, he started announcing their comings and goings to his parents and developed his wonderful announcing voice. At the ripe old age of eleven he was hired by the P&O railroad to announce trains and never looked back.



Harry "Jazzbo" Heywood (Clarence and others) is a Canadianborn film actor and entertainer who is best known to American movie audiences for his starring roles in the two-reel comedy shorts Harry on the Move!, Harry Takes Manhattan! and Wild and Harry!, which he co-wrote and shot with his dear friend, the gifted screen director and producer Oscar Micheaux. Since arriving in New York in 1939, he has had the honor of appearing onstage with Lena Horne, Louis Armstrong, and The Great Paul Robeson!



Jake Laurents (Young George/George Bailey) loves Christmastime because he loves heartwarming, everyman stories. In addition to his film work, his radio fans have heard him as Walter Denton (covering for Dick Crenna when he got laryngitis) in Our Miss Brooks, as hard-boiled private dick Pat Novak (filling in for a vacationing Jack Webb), and as mysterious crime-fighter The Whistler. A man of many voices, Mr. Laurents loves taking George Bailey from age twelve to forty-six before your ears. Also, fans, rest assured that Mr. Laurents uses every product advertised on these broadcasts, currently sporting lustrously manageable, clean hair.



Hope Merriwether (Rose and others) Hope credits her love of the written word and her devotion to radio performances to her childhood friendship with Samuel Clemens, who was a neighbor in his later years. He encouraged young Hope to read, and, as his eyesight began to fail, he asked her to read aloud to him. Mr. Clemens was the one who told her to give a distinct voice to every character as she read. This advice has served her well in her long career in live radio show performing, and even before that when her brother lost his sight. She accompanied him to the school for the blind he attended, where she became the most requested reader by

all of the students. A local radio show producer happened to hear her read, and immediately offered her the title role in *Mother Carey's Chickens*, based on the book of the same name. She is delighted to lend her "voices" to this delightful holiday show.



Lana Sherwood (Violet/Zuzu/Mrs. Hatch) The character actress began her career as script girl for the National Broadcasting Company, when Virginia Payne's appendix burst mid-broadcast, necessitating Sherwood stepping in for 'America's Mother of The Air' - *Ma Perkins*. She supplied voices for Fibber McGee's wife 'Molly', and pint-sized neighbor, 'Teeny', during Marion Jordan's hiatus from *Fibber McGee and Molly*. Sherwood originated the role of plain-speaking Joe Friday's 'Ma' on *Dragnet* as well as voicing all child witnesses. She moonlighted as the femme fatales on Webb's private dick series,

Pat Novack. In a recent interview, Miss Sherwood commented on the unusual range of her characters; "Bats, bitches, and babies... that's me – but it's a living."



Trevor Ward (Uncle Billy and others) - Mr. Ward began his training in the school of hard knockabouts on the vaudeville stage at the ripe old age of two as part of the Famous Flip Flop Family. After a short stint in the Army for Uncle Sam, Trevor found a new career with the USO, performing on the ground and on the airwaves for the troops. Mr. Ward is best known around America as Mr. Pippin the apple seller on the weekly radio program *Morty, McGuffin and Me*, as well as for his performance as Jalmari Jarkko and the entire Finnish Army in the WBFR production *The Finnish Are Coming, The Finnish Are Coming!*

About the Crew



Marjorie Applebee (Stage Manager) – Marjorie's parents told her she was born in a trunk while they were working the vaudeville circuit. It is no wonder she was drawn to theatre, but largely remains behind the scenes. WBFR has been her "home" since she moved to New York, and she is proud to be part of this heart-warming story.




Trixie Devine (Organist) - Trixie's grandfather was a world famous inventor of musical percussion instruments. Often as she was growing up, she would sneak into his workroom where she taught herself how to play his inventions, especially the organ chimes. She dedicates tonight's show to her grandfather, John Calhoun Deagan, and she hopes you enjoy *It's a Wonderful Life*.



Ray "Flash" Gordon (Foley) - Apprenticed under Jack Foley at Universal Studios and worked on the film classic *Dracula*. In 1938 he moved to the new Columbia Square on Sunset to work in the "new" medium of radio. He remained with Universal until 1941 when he moved to New York to work for the WBFR family.



Dayton Parker (Foley) - Dayton has been with the WBFR radio show since 1943, making his way to New York from the West coast to pursue acting on Broadway. He learned the craft of sound effects interning at the Walt Disney studios, and even worked on the first Mickey Mouse animated film *Steamboat Willie*.
