

Director's Statement

I fell in love with storytelling in childhood — namely theatre. This was mostly because, growing up, the town I'm from in Mexico didn't have a cinema, so puppetry, dance, and surrealism was all the entertainment available to us, it was awesome. Looking back at my professional and scholastic experiences, I see that rooted in all of them was a paradigm of theatre making: a quest for joy and community through the act of performance.

For this play, *Real Women Have Curves*, the starting ground was those two ideas: First, the opportunity to engage with our LA community, and second, to issue resistance to the hegemonic narratives we see on our screens every day. We do so by celebrating 'joy.' This play is not a lecture on what 'one group' in our LA community is forced to overcome, nor is it confined as a play about Latina/Latinx/Latine persons, but about Angelenos. The people next door to you and me, the people who teach our kids, sew our clothes, heal the sick, and put out fires — for some of them, security is now threatened by misguided policy that uses 'enforcement' to occult bigotry — but they are our community too. This play, this collective event of seeing and hearing — where you too, are part of the performance — is an act of celebration that misinformation can be undone, that within our city lies tremendous power to change the world, and that the simple act of creating, doing and joy is resistance.

MARCO RIVERA - DIRECTOR

Director, creative producer, and UCLA School of Theatre, Film, and Television - Directing and Dramaturgy alumni. Marco has developed live-event, film, and television content for: Walt Disney Imagineering (Star Wars Land and The Downtown Disney District), Warner Bro's Companies (Do Good Films and 19f Productions), Violent Pink Productions, and Create The Writer's Room. Marco's theatrical work includes: Karen Sacarías' *Just Like Us* with the UCLA Latinx Theatre Comunión, Robert Wilson's *Letters to a Man* with Mikhail Baryshnikov, the USA premiere of Lope De Vega's *Women and Servants* as part of LATC's Encuentro Festival, the USA premiere of Dea Loher's *Life on Praça Roosevelt*, the West Coast premiere of *The Pride* by Alexi Kaye Campbell, *Swan Lake* at the Ricardo Montalban Theatre and Hudson Theatre in NYC and, earlier this year, the premiere of *Watermarks* by Abbott Alexander. Alongside *Real Women Have Curves*, Marco's other directing project, *Beat of the Traps*, is currently running at the Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) in NYC until December 2025. ALEXANDRA CARDONA – ASST STAGE MANAGER/DRAMATURG

Alexandra is a director, writer, and producer whose work spans theatre and film. Her directing credits include *The Effect, Once on This Island,* and *Lost Girl,* with collaborations at Modern Minority Theatre, Impulse Theatre Company, and Aeneid Theatre Company. BEN LUPEJKIS - SET DESIGNER

From ark, to river boat (Murder on the Nile), to the world of a Titanic survivor (Unsinkable Molly Brown), to smalltown Texas (Sordid Lives), radio studio (It's a Wonderful Life), suburban backyard (All My Sons), northern English manor (An Inspector Calls), and French apartment (Private Lives), Ben creates an evocative environment, with a sense of whimsy and attention to inventive detail, for actors and audiences to unleash their imaginations.

RICHARD POTTHOFF - LIGHTING DESIGNER

Richard is a lifetime Kentwood member and past president having first joined the theatre during the 1983 production of *Chicago* as a novice follow spot operator. He even snagged an acting award for his portrayal of the Captain of the Inquisition. After a long hiatus due to some nagging health issues, he is happy to return to Kentwood as the Lighting Designer of *Real Women Have Curves*.


