

# Director's Note

What is a stereotype? Webster says it's something conforming to a fixed or general pattern; Especially a standardized mental picture that is held in common by members of a group and that represents an oversimplified opinion, prejudiced attitude, or uncritical judgment. Being said, oftentimes the effects from a stereotype or patterned disposition halts humanity from moving forward and/or leaning in at the conversive table. When I think about classism, bigotry, marginalization, implicit/explicit bias, conscious/unconscious bias, etc. etc... I think about all the many micros of stereotomy over hundreds of years that have woven the world's blanket of separation.

By the Way, Meet Vera Stark from my lens is a combination, a complement of two things... An investigation of colorism, misogyny and racism in Hollywood. And it's a love story to all the beautiful shades, colors and textures of Black women throughout history who gave themselves then so that we have ourselves now.

By the Way, Meet Vera Stark takes place in the palette of 1933, 1973 and 2003. Lynn (the playwright) mentions her love for screwball comedies of the 1930s as her entryway into the play. This really sets the pace and grounding for the ideas being explored in the play. I feel the play also uses tragedy, farce, parody, pathos, humor, social commentary, irony and satirical devices to interrogate questions like What happened to those actors of that time? Where are they? Who are they? Why did they?

As the son of a mother who has lived a life of compromise and sacrifice all while loving and giving unmeasurably to the world, I lift up these colossal and iconic Black women. And I hold space, love on, honor and give infinite flowers to allIIII Black women. You are the standard. Your light gives hope. It fuels... It heals. Thank You!
